## FAMOUS HUNTER REPORTED LOST

Fears are now entertained for the safety of Mr. Philip Sellick the famous New Brunswick hunter and trapper who has for many years made his home and head quarters in the vicinity of Moncton. He was last seen sitting on a log in the heart of the Canaan woods, eating a piece of bread and a chunk of salt pork which appeared to be all the rations he had with him. As he has always been accustomed to taking long trips alone through the wilderness his absence was not much noticed, until lately, when his prolonged absence from his home at Bonnell's Corner has caused fears to be entertained for his safety.

A returning hunter coming from the Canaan told a friend in this city that he had met Mr. Sellick at place called the Little Northwest meadows in the Canaan woods. The old man was sitting on a log eating a piece of bread and a chunk of boiled salt pork. The hunter asked him if he wanted any food saying that he would give him some if he did. The old man replied that he had enough to eat and was coming out of the woods right away. On hearing this the hunter departed leaving Sellick sitting on the log. If Mr. Sellick does not turn up soon, a search party may be sent out to look for him.

Mr. Sellick has been a noted character for many years in this section of the province. He has almost peculiar knack of capturing wild animals alive. At one time and another he has had moose, deer, wolves, bears, and many other wild creatures in captivity about his farm. Some years ago he ran a sort of a circus in this city.

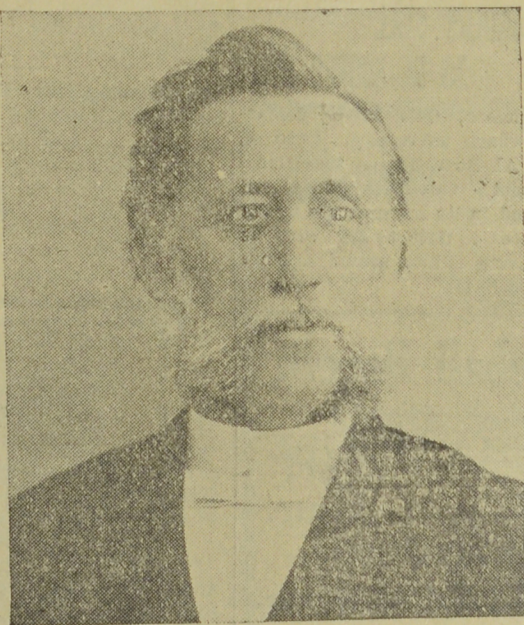

## FORMER FREDERICTON PASTOR DEAD

Halifax, N. S., Oct. 22—A telegram to his son-in-law, M. O. Cromwell, announces the death of Rev. J. A. Rogers, D. D., aged seventy-two, pastor of Methodist churches of this city, and one of the most eloquent preachers in the maritime provinces. Few men were better known or more highly respected. He filled with distinction every office in the gift of the Methodist conference, and exercised

an influence as wide as it was beneficial.

At the time of his death Doctor Rogers was pastor of Gower street church, St. Johns, Newfoundland, one of the finest and most important churches in the connection. He is survived by his wife, a daughter of the late Dr. Rufus Black of this city, and by three daughters and three sons. Rev. A. S. Rogers of Yarmouth is his eldest son.

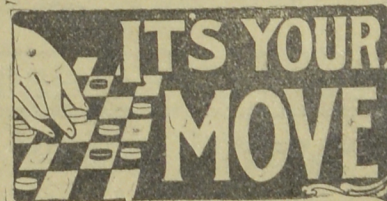
