## HYDE'S TRIAL NEXT

Kansas City, Mo., Sept. 6-When the case of Dr. B. Clarke Hyde is called in the Criminal Court here on Monday the prosecuting attorney will ask that the trial be delayed until December in order that he may have more time to prepare his evidence. It is expected that the defense will agree to the postponement.

This will be the fourth trial of the amous case. Dr. Hyde is held for the alleged murder of his wife's uncle Col. Thomas H. Swope, a millionaire philanthropist of this city. The motive alleged for the crime was a desire that his wife might inherit a part of her uncle's fortune. Col. Swope died on October 2, 1909. Dr. Hyde was tried in the May following, convicted and sentenced to imprisonment for life. The high court remanded the case for a new trial. The second trial ended abruptly when one of the jurors escaped from the marshals. The third trial resulted in a disagree ment of the jury.

#### SAVING THE SEALS

Only International Agreement Saved Them From Extinction

Russia, England, Japan and Ameri ca agreed to suspend sealing in the open sea for fifteen years and sealing on land for five years. The need for this close season is explained by George Archibald Clark:

It respected neither sex nor condition of the animals found, and the catch fell principally upon the nursing females, which were taken upon the summer feeding grounds in Behring Sea; for when the migration route of the seals had been covered the sealers entered Behring Sea and lay in wait for the mother seals as they visited the fishing banks one or two hundred miles distant from the islands for the purpose of feeding. As a result of the death of the mother, the dependent young starved to death on the rookeries. In the fall of 1896 sixteen thousand fur seal pups died of starvation on the rookeries of St. Paul and St. George islands.

As pelagic sealing developed through the increasing number of ships, it catch grew from 8,000 at the beginning to a maximum of 140,000 in 1894 but this could not last, and with the declining herd the pelagic catch als began to decline. In the season 1911, the last of the industry, t 1911, the last of the industry, the catch numbered about 15,000 skins. From the known catch of the sealing fleets and from conservative estimate as to animals allied but not recovered it is apparent that more than a million breeding female fur seals and like number of unborn and depender young were destroyed during the thirty odd, years the pelagic industry by odd years the pelagic industry ha been in operation. No scientists have yet suc ded in analyzing the liquors satisfactory results, but ident that they are of different kind since different species of the plant attract different insects.
