METHODIST PASTOR FACES CHARGES

Urbana, O., Sept. 9.—Methodist clergy and laity are arriving here in large numbers for the annual session to be opened tomorrow by the Cincinnati conference. At this conference a union with the Central Ohio conference will be completed and the merged organization will take on its new name of West Ohio Conference.

Delegates from Toledo and vicinity have brought with them for consideration by the conference a matter outside of the ordinary routine of business and which promises to enliven the proceedings in no small degree. This is a request that the conference take up for consideration and action the charges of immorality brought against Rev. M. J. Nash, pastor of the Methodist churches at Cygnet and one of two other small towns in Wood county. Several weeks ago a jury composed of five ministers, after an investigation of the charges, decided to suspend the Rev. Mr. Nash until the meeting of the conference here.

The charges were originally made by David Williams of Cygnet and involved the minister's relations with the wife of a man residing near Jerry City, one of the towns where Mr. Nash held a pastorate. The minister is said to have admitted being with the woman in a vacant house but asserted that he had been guilty of nothing more than imprudence.
