FACTS ABOUT THE BIBLE

It will surprise many persons to learn that there are two chapters in the Bible which are practically idencical, these being the 19th chapter tical, these being the 19th chapter of the Second Book of Kings and the 37th chapter of Isaiah. There are 929 chapters with 592,493 words in the Old Testament, and 260 chapters and 181,253 words in the New Testament. Asked off-hand, one would probably say there were more words in the Bible than in Shakespeare's works, but, as a matter of fact, the balance is in favor of the Bard, who has the respectable total of 814,780, or 41,317 more than the Bible. Altogether his plays have no fewer than 1,277 characters, one of whom (Hamlet) has 11,610

plays have no fewer than 1,277 characters, one of whom (Hamlet) has 11,610 words to deliver.

"Hamlet," indeed, is the longest play, containing as it does 3,930 lines, while the "Comedy of Errors," is the shortest, with 1,777 lines. The longest word is "honorificabilitudinatibus," which is certainly a tongue-twister. The curious can find all the letters of the alphabet in the 21st verse of the 7th chapter of Ezra, while referthe 7th chapter of Ezra, while reference to the 117th Psalm will show that it is not only the shortest chapter in the Bible, but also the middle chapter of the book.
