Rev. Chas. T. Young of Plaster Rock, and Rev. Archibald Lee of Rexton, have been registered under provincial statute to solemnize marriages.


ARCHBISHOP'S MESSMER'S 10th ANNIVERSARY

Milwaukee, Wis., Dec. 10--Today was recalled as the tenth anniversary of the appointment of Archbishop Sebastian Gebhard Messmer as the head of the archdiocese of Milwaukee. Although there was no official celebration of the anniversary, the Archbishop was the recipient of congratulations from many of his intimate friends.

Archbishop Messmer was born in Goldach, Switzerland, August 29, 1847, and received his education in Switzerland, at the University of Innsbruck, Austria, and at the Apollinare University, Rome. He was ordained priest July 23, 1871, and came to the United States as professor of theology at Seton Hall College, South Orange, N.J. In 1890 he became professor at the Catholic University in Washington, D.C., and two years later he was consecrated bishop of Green Bay, Wis. He was appointed archbishop of Milwaukee on December 10, 1903.


