UNITED BAPTIST HOME MISSION BOARD

(St. John Globe.)

The annual meeting of the United Baptist Home Mission Board for the Maritime Provinces was held Tuesday morning and afternoon in the mission rooms on Prince William street. The reports presented were all of a most encouraging character. The finances for the year are not yet all in hand, but the total receipts to date were \$5,099.29, to which has got to be added between \$400 and \$500 from the Bradshaw Fund. There is a balance on hand in the treasury of \$2,337.91, but these figures will be slightly reduced when last month's accounts are paid. Two young men from the Bible Training Institute in Glasgow, Scotland, have been settled on fields by the Home Mission Committee within the last month. These were Mr. G. C. S. Mackay, and Mr. E. J. Barrass. A new house of worship was dedicated August 31 at Mount Whitley, Westmorland County. The home mission field at Pokiok, York County, has a church under construction at the present time. Another church at Greay Rapids, Northumberland County, is nearing completion.

Three special grants were made under the minimum salary fund account. This fund has been established to bring the maximum salary of pastors up to \$800 and the fields to which the grants were made were Grand Falls, Musquash and Penobscuit. Several of the regular grants were made to the home mission fields for the incoming year.

Immediately following the meeting of the Home Mission Board the executive of the Association convened and discussed the details of the program for the meeting to be held in Brussels Street Church from September 23 to 26. Several changes were made, among the most important being the changing of the meetings under the auspices of the ladies from Thursday afternoon to Wednesday. This change was made at the request of Mrs. Carrie A. Robinson, field secretary of women's work in New England, who will be the principal speaker and who finds it impossible to be in the city on Tuesday. She can be here Tuesday and Wednesday however, and her subject will be His Star in the East. Mrs. Robinson is a woman of engaging personality who is closely in touch with her subject and it is anticipated her addresses cannot help but be both useful and inspiring.

FIRE FIGHTER'S PARADE IN NEW YORK

New York, Sept. 5.-The convention of the International Association of Fire Engineers, which has held forth here since the beginning of the week, culminated today in a grand street parade. Fifteen hundred fire fighters, representing the paid and volunteer departments of the metropolitan district and many near-by cities and towns, were in line. The procession also included a display of fire-fighting apparatus, from the old "hand tub" to the modern motor-propelled engines and trucks. Following the disbanding of the parade the fire fighters assembled on Riverside Drive for the unveiling of the Firemen's Monument. The monument is an imposing affair of bronze and granite, representing a fire engine drawn by three plunging horses.

NEWS FORECAST FOR THE COMING WEEK

Washington, D.C., Sept. 6.-Of interest to the politicians will be Monday's special election in the Third Congressional District of Maine to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Representative Goodwin. It is a three-cornered contest between the Democratic, Republican and Progressive candidates, with each party predicting success.

Another interesting anniversary of the week will be the centenary of the birth of Major General John Sedgewick, a distinguished soldier of the Indian, Mexican and Civil wars, and one of the ablest officers of the Army of the Potomac. General Sedgewick was born at Cornwall, Conn., Sept. 13, 1813. He was killed near Spotsylvania Court House, Va., May 9, 1864.

At the invitation of the Swiss Federal Council delegates representing the principal industrial countries of the world will assemble in Berne to consider the drafting of an international agreement to prohibit the employment of children below specified ages and to fix a maximum ten-hour day for workers within certain other ages.

Other events of the week abroad will include the annual grand maneuvers of the German army, which will take place in Silesia, and the annual meeting of the British Association for the Advancement of Science, in Birmingham.
