## LAWMAKERS AT THE HAGUE

(Continued from page one.)

The present state of unrest in many parts of the world, the recent war in the Balkans and the strained relations between the United States and Mexico, combine to give added importance to the gathering of the world's lawmakers who advocate peaceful arbitration as the panacea of all international ills. The American delegates will present to the conference Secretary of State Bryan's proposal for an armistice between would-be belligerents and will urge its adoption by the union.

The Interparliamentary Union was founded in 1887 by Sir Randal Cremer of the British House of Commons. The aim of the founders was to bring about international agreements for legislation action by the various governments on arbitration, the promotion of commercial relations, granting of equal rights to all nations and their citizens and the enjoyment of common privileges by all.

The membership of the union is confined to actual members of the national legislative bodies of the world. Enrolled in its membership are more than 2,000 members of the parliamentary bodies of Great Britain, Germany, France, Russia, Austria-Hungary, Denmark, Belgium, Holland, Greece, Norway, Roumania, Portugal, Switzerland, Sweden, Serbia, Turkey, Japan and the United States.

The organization has the support of all the leading nations and maintains a permanent bureau in The Hague. To meet the expenses appropriations are made annually by the national legislatures. The union is absolutely non-partisan. It does not concern itself with the internal affairs of any country. It imposes no obligations upon its members except adherence to the principle of arbitration as a means of settling international controversies.
