## MISDIRECTED ZEAL

The Teronto Saturday Night hands out the following to the Lord's Day

'The most recent example of bulldozing in connection with the Lord's Day Act that has been brought to the attention of Saturday Night is an edict whereby the retail merchant who has a slot machine for the sale of chewing gum outside his shop is obliged to bring it indoors over Sunday or put it out of commission during that period. Such a restriction is based on a purely wanton desire to place iron restrictions on the general public during the first day of the week. No one can seriously be. lieve that it imperils the spiritual and moral welfare of anyone to perform the simple act of dropping a penny in the slot and punch out a piece of chewing gum merely because the day is Sunday. Do Sab trarians assume that even for a man's jaws to work on the Sabbath is a breach of the fourth commandment? The limited coterie which forced these laws on a lethargic community assuredly work their jaws seven days a week, though in a different way. It would be well if this matter could be tested in the courts, since the restriction can have no basis in law. The professed aim of Lord's Day legislation is to abolish unnecessary labor on the first day of the week. Since this involves no labor except on the mechanism of the slot machine the authorities are assuredly strain ing the statute. Saturday Night would willingly contribute toward the cost of a test case and there are many intelligent citizens ready to do
