NOTICE TO QUIT GIVEN FAMILIES AT MARYSVILLE

Canadian Cotton Co., Said to be Preparing for Large Importation of Labor---That Method Taken to Provide House-Room

A number of people who have been living in the houses owned by the Canadian Cottons Limited at Marysville, have been ordered to quit their premises by October 1 next. The notice gives no reason for the action being taken. Some of those notified to leave have been living in Marysville for years and some are employed now in the Cotton Mill. These facts make the action of the company the more surprising but its officials at Marysville say that the notices to quit have been given on orders received from outside.

The Canadian Cottons Limited has made repeated efforts to increase the number of operatives at the Marysville mill and it is thought that the present action is taken to provide house-accommodation for large families which will supply more hands for the mill than do the families notified to quit the houses. It is said that twenty-two notices in all have been issued. Two of the young men who were ordered to quit gave up their positions with the company this morning and are in the city looking for employment. They are also anxious to rent houses in Fredericton. The main subject of conversation in Marysville today is in reference to

DOHERTY-HIBBARD CO. TROUBLE PRESENTS|RE-MARKABLE FEATURE

John Doherty of Springhill Accused Hon. H. F. McLeod of Having C. T. Act Used to Compel Him to Accept Co.'s Terms

Trouble between Mr. John Doherty and the Hibbard Company Limited, with interesting features has arisen as the result of the closing of the road at Springhill, which goes from the main road at the Springhill Hotel to the mouth of Springhill Creek by the company in the course of construction of the St. John & Quebec Railway. Mr. Doherty, it is understood, is firm in his attitude and legal action is probable.

IMPORTANT ROAD.

The road in question is one of importance to the people of Springhill, being that used by those concerned in bank-logs and also by others and has been open as far back as the memory of the residents goes. A railway embankment built across it has closed it and a passage-way must be opened through it or another road provided by the Hibbard Company. The only available route for another road must cross Mr. Doherty's property. The Hibbard Company, it is said, made an offer to Mr. Doherty but the offer came so far short of the value placed upon the required right-of-way that it was turned down at once. Subsequent developments occurred and brought about the clash between Mr. Doherty

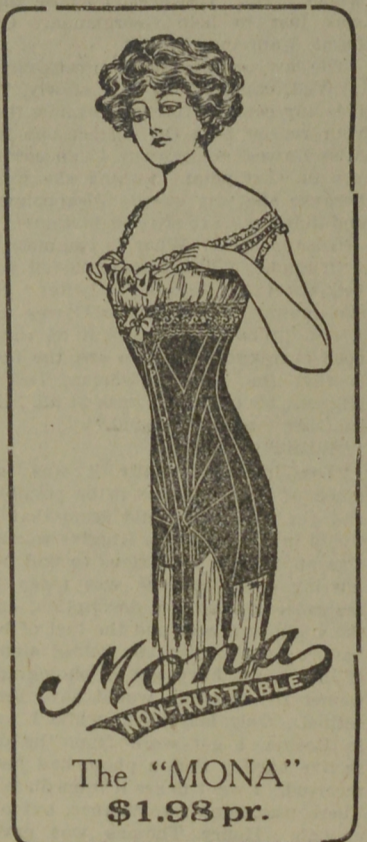
