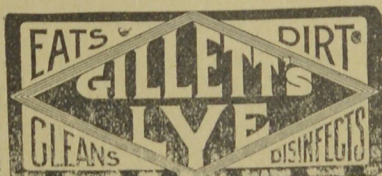
MEETING AT PORT ELGIN

supported and endorsed on the floor of parliament in the past have not been questions of race or language or religion. They are the principles of Liberalism, which are the same among the English as among the French and the same among the French as among the English. They would eventually govern, if Canada and the government were to be carried on in the interests of the community at large and not for the benefit of a small portion of it. That is what we have all fought for in years gone by and that is what we must all fight for now again."

Hon. Mr. Lemieux also addressed the meeting.

CHALLENGE TO THE TORIES.

Chateaugay, Sept. 30.—If the challenge of the Hon. Sydney Fisher, the Liberal candidate in Chateaugay county, is accepted, the campaign will afford some very interesting meetings, as some of the best Conservative and Liberal speakers in Canada will meet on the same platform. The Liberals have taken up the gauntlet thrown down by the Conservatives and in spite of the shortness of the time, they are rallying to the battleground.

The Conservatives have promised Mr. Morris their best aid and the Liberals are not being behindhand. Such men as the Hon. George Graham, the Hon. Rodolphe Lemieux, the Hon. Mackenzie King will fight side by side with their old conferees, and the great Liberal chieftain himself, Sir Wilfrid Laurier, will come into the constituency for two large public meetings.

The letter in which the Hon. Sydney Fisher has communicated his request for joint meetings to Mr. Jas. Morris of St. Chrysostome, reads as follows:

"My Dear Sir:—
"The Liberals of the County of Chateaugay have done me the honor to nominate me as their candidate in this election and I have accepted. I find that it is the custom in Chateaugay for a series of meetings to be arranged and the opposite parties to be invited to be present.

"I enclose a list of our meetings and shall be very happy to have you or your representative discuss the questions of the day with us.

"Personally I have never cared to attend public meetings on Sunday, and I would not care to depart from this custom.

"I have not the pleasure of personal acquaintance with you but I trust to have that advantage soon and I am sure that our relations in this contest will be of the most pleasant character.

S.—In connection with the list of meetings I will take the reply at the first at Ormstown and St. Clothilde, Chateaugay Village, St. Chrysostome and St. Martine and you will have it at Howick, St. Philomene, St. Antoine and Chateaugay Basin. "At the nomination meeting I am at your disposition for you to have the reply."

STALWARTS WILL HELP.

The Hon. Sydney Fisher has taken hold of the campaign as Liberal nominee in Chateaugay County with a strong hand and he has been assured of the united support of all prominent Liberals in the county.

Liberals declare that the campaign will be a clean one from start to finish. There will be no effort to outbid the Hon. Robert Rogers in his attempt to buy the county.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier will address two great meetings in the interests of Mr. Fisher on October 8th and 9th, at Ormstown and St. Martine respectively.

The Hon. Sydney Fisher has challenged Mr. James Morris and his representatives to speak at joint meetings.

The Hon. George P. Graham, the Hon. Rodolphe Lemieux, the Hon. Mackenzie King, Mr. James Robb, M.P.; Mr. Roch. Lanctot, M.P.; Mr. L. J. Papineau, M.P. for Beauharis; Mr. Honore Mercier, M.P. for Chateaugay, Mr. Severin Letourneau, M.P.P.; Mr. A. F. Leggett, Mr. McMaster and other Liberal stalwarts will speak throughout the riding.

Meetings have been arranged for every day except Sunday, when the Liberal candidate prefers not to address any meetings.
