CHEAPER COAL  
OVER NEW LINE OF  
CANADIAN PACIFIC

Rate offered to Local Firms About Half That by Other Routes---Advantageous to Manufacturers

Manufacturers in this city will get coal from the Minto fields at a considerably lower rate, according to present expectations, when the C. P. R. begins operation of the Fredericton-Norton division. It is reported that a rate of eighty cents per ton has been offered for the transportation of the coal thirty-two miles to Minto. That rate is about half that which is charged by alternative routes now in use. Via St. John the rate is about \$1.65 per ton and via McGivney Junction about \$1.60 per ton.

No public announcement of rates on the new line has been made yet but local consumers of coal confidently expect to see quite an amount knocked off of the price. Cheaper coal will give a great impetus to manufacturing in this section.

At present the coal which is being brought over the new line is for the use of the C.P.R. For private buyers the Minto coal still comes via St. John or McGivney.

## JUDGE BIDLAKE

J. A. MORRISON'S  
PIERCE-ARROW CAR  
BADLY SMASHED

Struck Tree Near His Residence This Morning---Driver Bernard McCann Escaped Injury---Running Gear Undamaged

Mr. J. A. Morrison's big grey seven-passenger Pierce-Arrow car, which was imported last spring, came to grief this morning and as a result of an accident will be out of commission for some time. The car is now at the Fredericton Garage, where repairs will be made, new parts being brought from the factory to replace those damaged.

The accident occurred near Mr. Morrison's residence. The car was driven by Bernard McCann, an employee of Mr. Morrison, who was learning to drive the auto. In attempting to make the turn into the highway at the gate the driver turned the steering gear too far with the result that the car turned back and ran into some trees. It then returned to the highway, where it stopped.

In its collision with the trees the mud-guards were crumpled and smashed and the rear seat was demolished. McCann escaped uninjured however.

As a result of the accident the upper part of the car must be rebuilt. The running gear was uninjured.
