THE NEW WELLAND

Kingston, Canada.

As finally located the enlarged Welland ship canal will conform closely to the route of the present canal from 531—d 3 mos. Lake Erie to Allanburg, a point about midway between Lakes Erie and Ontario. From Allanburg an entirely new location will be followed. This will cross the present canal twice, finally reaching Lake Ontario at the foot of Ten Mile Creek—three miles cast of the reconstruction. east of the present terminus at Port Dalhousie. The total length will be 25 miles. The fall of 325½ feet will 25 miles. The fall of 325½ feet will be accomplished by seven locks, each having a lift of 46½ feet. Each lock will be 800 feet long and 80 feet wide, with a minimum depth of water over miter sills of 30 feet. The canal will be 200 feet wide at the bottom, designed for a depth of 30 feet, but excavated for only 25 feet for the present. This will permit dredging out the remaining 5 feet at any future time.
