#### FOREST RESERVES

Thirty-five Thousand Eight Hundred Square Miles of Reservation

Over ten thousand five hundred square miles were added recently to the existing area of Dominion Forest Reserves, making a total of over the existing area of Dominion Forest Reserves, making a total of over thirty-five thousand eight hundred square miles of reserved forest land in the Western Provinces under Dom-inion jurisdiction. Of this reserved area, three thousand seven hundred and eighty-two square miles are found in Alberta, one thousand eight hun-dred and seventy-two square miles in hundred and eight square miles in for the fact that practically all the eastern slope of the Rockies has been set apart as a forest reserve, not only to perpetuate the supply of timber, set apart as a forest reserve, not only to perpetuate the supply of timber, but to preserve and equalize the flow of the large prairie rivers which have their source in this reserved area. These western reserves are created by the Dominion Government as ofted These western reserves are created by the Dominion Government as cited in the Act "for the maintenance, pro-tection and reproduction of the timber growing thereon, or which may here-after grow thereon, for the conver-sation of the minerals and the protec-tion of the animals, birds, and fish therein, and for the maintenance of conditions favorable to a continuous water supply." To accomplish these ends the reserves must first be pro-tected from fire, and under the direc-tion of technical foresters and supertion of technical foresters and supertion of technical lotesters and hapen visors, fire-lines are being cut or ploughed, trails are being cut, tele-phone lines and lookout stations in-stalled, "caches" of tools cistribute in accessible places throughout the re-serves, and efficient patrols establish ed in accessible places throughout th

reserves, and efficient patrols estal lished. Nor is the timber so protected a lowed to die of old age. The fore-ters determine at what diameter i each section the maximum production is attained and when the trees reacthis size, they are granted free or fo a nominal sum to homesteaders wh apply to the forest officials for cutting permits. Care is taken not to allow over-cutting, for it is the forester aim to crop the forest repetually and aim to crop the forest pretually and at the same time increase its produc-ing capacity by proper methods of management. Thus, by this policy of forest reservation, instead of denuded hillsides, drifting sand and barren rocks and muskegs, these areas will in time be covered with great tracts of forest owned by the people and supplying their wants, not only now but to all future time, when countries with less foresight will be in the throes of a timber famine.






