Echoes from Summerside W. C. T. U. Convention, Mrs. J. J. Colter. Thirty-seven delegates from N. B. crossed on Steamer Empress on Sep. 5th to attend the 7th N. B. and P. E. I. Convention. Every county in this province was represented either by delegate or report sent in of work done. Hostesses with carriages were at the station to receive incoming guests and many of the wealthiest homes in the town threw open their doors with the hearty welcome for which Summerside is noted. The few who had not been in this very progressive section for nearly a score of years failed to recognize a single familiar object save the beautiful face of nature which ever remains unchanged. Forty-five delegates registered and there were visitors beside.

On Saturday morning convention opened with usual exercises, a welcome, early in the session was extended to Mrs. Deborah Knox Livingston, representing the White Ribboners of the United States, she at once became the controlling spirit, deciding all knotty questions and giving brief but inspiring addresses until the close of convention. Large congregations listened to her words with pleasure and profit.

rence of the first division, inspected the line from Gibson to Minto, inspecting frogs and switches.

Coal is being delivered daily to the Marysville Cotton Mill over the Marysville spur of the Fredericton & Grand Lake line, and grading for a siding to connect with the warehouse at Marysville is now being done under the supervision of Mr. Thomas Whelpley. The warehouse is to be enlarged. On the main line A. E. Trites & Son are ballasting at Mile 16 and two through sidings are being installed at Ripples Station by Foreman Sutton. On the Central Railway G. Fred Baird is carrying out his contract ballasting, widening fills, etc.

There are many indications that the country served by the new C.P.R. division is developing rapidly. At Minto at the present time seven tenements are being built by the Northfield Coal Company.

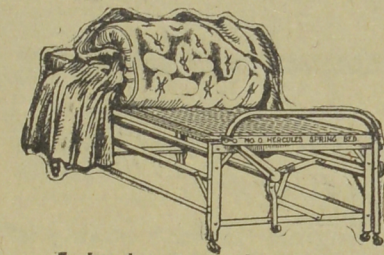
