He only occupied the seat for one term as his election was invalidated by the courts and upon offering for re-election he was defeated. He met with financial difficulties and lost control of his newspaper soon eafter his retirement from politics. In 1896 the Liberals appointed him to an office in the stores department, of the I.C.R., which he held up to the time of his death.
