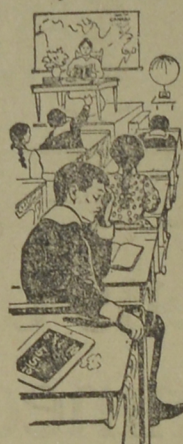

URSINUS PRESIDENT INAUGURATED

Collegeville, Pa., Oct. 7.—In the presence of many distinguished educators representing nearly all the prominent institutions of learning in the east, Prof. George Leslie Onwake was today inaugurated president of Ursinus College, succeeding Rev. A. E. Keigwin, D.D.

President Onwake was born at Greencastle, Pa., July 13, 1871, and received an excellent education preparing himself for a pedagogical career. He graduated from the State Normal School at Shippensburg, Pa., in 1893 and then continued his studies at the Mercersburg Academy, Ursinus College and Yale University. After having graduated from Yale with the degree of Bachelor of Divinity, in 1901, he became lecturer on education at Ursinus College. In 1903 he became dean and professor of history

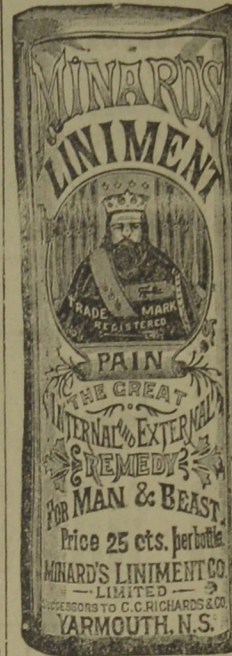
