The Sheep Pays

Money invested in sheep will nearly double itself in one year, since the fleece will pay for the feed and care of the sheep, and the lambs, often two or the sheep, and the tambs, often two per ewe, are the profit. It is estimated that ten sheep may be kept where one cow may, and the risk is much less. It may be said that the sheep always It may be said that the sheep always carries her pocketbook with her. If she dies, her pelt or fleece pays her funeral expenses. If she lives, her wool in the spring and her lambs in the fall pay double revenue. No other stock pays as large a percentage of clear profit on the money invested. Nothing else will build up a rundown farm as quickly as a flock of sheep. While pasturing, the sheep's manure is distributed about so evenly that no ''Grabe-Nuts and manure spreader could equal the sheep in its work.


