BIRMINGHAM LADY

WRITES OF CANADA

Mrs. A. Harris of Birmingham, England, who recently visited her uncle, Mr. D. F. Knight of this city, writes of her trip as follows:

After a journey of ten days across the Atlantic, uneventful till we got just outside Newfoundland, when we ran into the usual fogs and icebergs of that region, I landed at Quebec. The last few days on board had been terribly cold as we had been amongst the berris. Now, on entering Quebec, I seemed to have landed in the summer country. The temperature was hot and brilliant sunshine flooded the landscape. The Heights of Abraham, the entrance to Quebec, formed a natural guard to the city. To an English eye the scenery on either side of the railway was a pure delight. The spruce, fir, maple, pine and other fine trees lining the track conveyed a sense of natural beauty almost untouched by the progress of civilization. Here and there delightful springs and tiny rivulets made rippling music. The brush and undergrowth are more richly luxuriant than in England. To a Britisher there appears a freedom from convention about the Canadians which is in keeping with a country as yet almost unspoiled by the inroads of civilization. My destination was Fredericton. Here I found a city of lofty tree-bordered streets. The St. John River, noble, stately and well wooded, flows through the city. I could never think of Fredericton without conjuring up a mental picture of this beautiful river. This description of another river fitsly applies to it.

"O could I flow like thee and make thy stream
My great example as it is my theme,
Though deep yet clear, gentle and yet not dull,
Strong without rage, without over-flowing full."

The St. John glides on ageless, immutable, untouched by the life that swirls on its banks; it is an image of fate.

The fine bridge which spans the river leads to the attractive little suburb of Marysville. The Frederictonians have the same breezy freedom of manner as the typical Canadians, but it has a little quaintness all its own expressed in speech and thought. I visited some farms up the Macnaquac River and in the Kingsclear and Queensbury district. I shall not soon forget the hearty welcome and the characteristic farmhouse face. The golden butter and cream, the buckwheat pancakes and molasses, the sweet corn, also the innocent merriment which prevailed our company. As I write, in fancy I hear the melodious tinkle of the cow-bells, the sighing of the summer wind in the giant trees, the scent of the hay—these all combine to make a memory of a most delightful holiday. The camp meeting of the Macnaquac, with their little band of earnest workers, earnest preachers, simple and direct in speech, is also something to be remembered. I said farewell lingeringly, regretfully and am now looking forward to yet another visit.

WITH THE SOCKEYES

An Irristible Lure to the People on the Coast

A rare and beautiful spectacle, seen once a year in coast towns like Vancouver, is that of the myriad of fishing boats which dot the fresh and salt waters. It is at night when the beacon lights of these cities of boats beckon from across the waves that the interested observer gets anything like an adequate conception of the number of those who hearken annually to the call of the sockeye which has since time immemorial proved an irresistible lure to the dwellers of the Pacific. These temporary boat cities claim an interesting variety of citizens for their floating population, from the man who is out for the mere sport of it to the cannery representative on business intent. It is an occasion when all nationalities are at one in a common interest, and the white man, the Japanese and the Indian sink their tribal differences at Neptune's altar. Along the shores of civilized and populated districts the salmon-nets are the chief ammunition of warfare and the sibilant, syphon-like sounds emanating from the wooden buttons which buoy them up from the boats possess a weird fascinating music unlike any other sound existent, and which invariably associates them with salmon hunting in the Pacific. In the wilds up the Fraser the Indian may be seen fishing in a more primitive manner with his home-made dip-net. But he is none the less skilful for that, and one might think that he is in league with the sockeye, so thoroughly is he versed in the secret of their ways and so successfully does he capture them. He is the most picturesque of all the fishermen and the unconscious harmony of his rhythmic movement as he raises and lowers his awkward dip-net from some precarious niche of the canyon walls fits him with the picture as perfectly as the jack-pine under whose shadow he works.

THE FARM WOODLOT

Free Expert Advice Obtainable on the Subject of Proper Care

With the increasing inaccessibility of the forests and the consequent high price of wood, the small wooded areas common on the farms of Canada are also increasing in economic value. They frequently occupy soils unsuited for agriculture and with a little care can be made to furnish the farmer with a continuous revenue in fuel, fence-posts, rails, poles and structural timber.

Unfortunately these woodlots are frequently allowed to deteriorate through carelessness or lack of knowledge on the part of the farmer. He takes great care to farm his agricultural lands to the best advantage, but often fails to realize that by farming his woodlot with the same care, he could get the same increase in productivity. Cattle and weeds are not permitted in a wheat-field, yet in the woodlot the cattle range at will, and instead of removing the weeds, the farmer allows these to increase in number, removing only the trees best suited to his purpose.

To save the farmer from himself, the Dominion Government appointed a technical forester with headquarters at the Forestry Branch, Ottawa, whose principal duty is to answer all inquiries, and give free advice on these matters. If necessary, arrangements can be made for a personal inspection of woodland properties by this expert. No conditions are imposed on the owner of the woodland, it being assumed that he who is anxious for advice will accept it when given. The expert looks over the stand, determines what species of trees are best suited to the soil and to the local market, shows how to improve the character of the crop and its rate of growth by proper thinning, and, if desired, gives advice regarding tree-planting, hardwood-coppicing, felling-methods and the most profitable sizes to be grown.

HENS AS BAROMETERS

A poultry fancier near Durham, England, produced curious results by altering and alternating the food given to his fowls.

It is known to many who have reared canaries for the market that Cayenne pepper, put into their food results in a notable difference in the character and shade of their plumage, giving the feathers a smoothness and reddish tinge which adds very much to the sum for which the birds may ordinarily be sold.

If the same ingredient be added to the diet, especially of white hens which have been hatched from carefully-selected eggs, their feathers become pale rose, and they flush to a brilliant red when the weather is damp and a storm is approaching. These hens thus become veritable barometers, and the progression of color from pale to brilliant is so exact that a scarlet hen stalking about the barnyard is regarded as certain prophecy of a storm which may be as much as twelve hours distant.—Tit-Bits.

White Pearl Divers

The statement of Captain Talboys, a pearly diver, of Broome, Western Australia, that the experiment of working luggers with white divers had been a failure, and that the majority of the divers brought out from England were either dead or paralyzed, has been contradicted flatly by divers. With the exception of two, all were, they said, very much alive, and were at present at work in different parts of the State.

Lambs and Mutton

Every year over 16,000,000 sheep and lambs are slaughtered in Australia for export, and beef totalling over 100,000,000 pounds is sent out annually for overseas consumption.

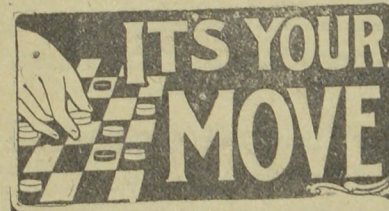
