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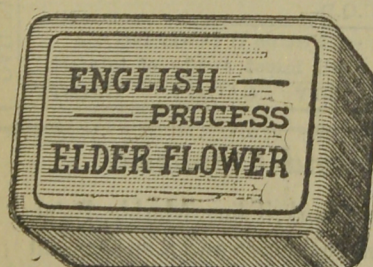

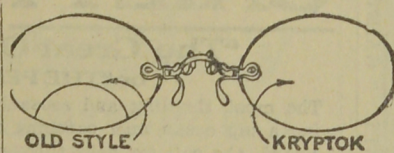

### A WORLD CONGRESS OF STUDENTS

Ithaca, N.Y., Aug. 29.—With an at-  
tendance of delegates representing the  
student bodies of universities and  
colleges in many parts of the world,  
the eighth biennial congress of the  
International Federation of Students  
assembled at Cornell University to-  
day and will continue in session un-  
til the latter part of next week. The  
congress is the first gathering of its  
kind, ever held in America. The inter-  
national federation was organized in  
Italy in 1898 and now has affiliated  
societies in many countries of Europe  
and in both North and South Ameri-  
ca. The principal object of the or-  
ganization is to create a closer unity  
among students of all nations and to  
consider the problem common to  
students of every country. At the  
conclusion of the sessions here the  
foreign delegates will be conducted  
on a two weeks' tour of the principal  
cities and educational centres of the  
Eastern States.

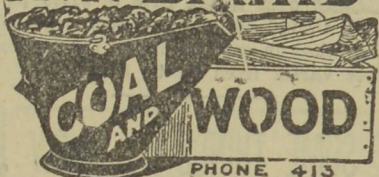
