cities, a number of which were closely identified with biblical events, were depicted and graphically described by the rev. lecturer. He spoke in an easy conversational tone and held the rapt attention of the audience for upwards of an hour.

A LOCAL BENEFACTOR.

In closing his interesting address, he stated that the people of Palestine were becoming tired of Turkish rule and were beginning to look to England for protection. He informed the audience that his trip to Palestine, which had been the greatest experience of his life, was due to the beaefaction of a member of St. Paul's congregation, who had been one of his closest friends for thirty years. (Applause.)

Mr. O. S. Crockett, M.P., after giving expression to the sentiments of all as to the high character of the evening's entertainment, moved a vote of thanks to Rev. Mr. Scott.

The motion was seconded by Prof. Styles of the U.N.B., in an interesting speech and unanimously adopted. Chancellor Jones extended greetings to the men of St. Paul's on behalf of the U.N.B. He stated that the institution had entered upon another prosperous year and he mentioned the fact that two professors added to the staff, were Presbyterians.

Judge Wilson, being called upon, responded with a happy speech which he embellished with several very amusing anecdotes.

There were also brief speeches by Prof. Kierstead, representing the George Street Baptist Church, and R. B. Wallace of the Brunswick Street Baptist Church.

The musical program included a vocal solo by Mr. George Brown, selection by a quartette composed of Messrs. Cooper, Mitchell, Redpath and Edney, and a solo by Mr. Redpath.

SULPHITE MILLS GIVE ROAD-SPRINKLING FLUID

Important Discovery Made at Queen's
University—Material is Better
Than Oil

Experiments recently conducted at Queen's University, Kingston, show conclusively that the dark-colored liquor obtained as a waste product in the manufacture of sulphite wood-pulp makes a better dressing for public highways than the low-grade oils now used. The two treatments were compared under identical conditions, and it was found that the same quantity of concentrated (four to one) waste liquor will last longer than road-oil when subject to the washing of rain, and has the additional advantage of being free from the nauseating odor so objectionable in low-grade oils. The Laurentide Pulp and Paper Company have been using this waste liquor for a considerable time on the streets of Grand Mere, Quebec, where their mills are located, and find it very satisfactory.

NEWS OF FREDERICTON TWENTY ONE YEARS AGO

(From The Weekly Herald of Saturday, October 1, 1892.)

NEW OFFICER—A new officer for the Infantry School Corps has arrived in the person of Capt. Wadmore. He is accompanied by his wife and three children.

WATCHED—Phillip Cox, who leaves Northumberland to accept a position in the St. John schools is to be presented with a gold watch by the school teachers as a token of the esteem they have for him.

AN OLD FRIEND—George R. Parkin has arrived here from England. He intends to visit the Northwest and Pacific slope but will be back here for the Christmas holidays. He has many strong affections for New Brunswick and especially Fredericton.

RESIGNED—Rev. F. D. Crawley a few days since submitted his resignation as pastor of the Brunswick Street Baptist Church and intimated that he would like to have immediate action taken. On Monday evening a meeting was held and it was unanimously decided that Mr. Crawley should retain the pastorate until May 1 next.

ALDERMANIC—The new plan proposed as to the election of aldermen from the city at large instead of from each ward as at present is attracting the attention of the citizens and is meeting with much favor. It will choose a board having a majority of voters. Under the present system, some men get in having very small majorities.

THE DEATH ROLL—Arthur Linrick, one of the well known men of Fredericton, died Wednesday afternoon at 3.30. On Tuesday last he underwent an operation and for a few days experienced some relief. He had spent many years here and for some time represented Queen's Ward at the Council Board. He leaves a wife, two daughters and two sons, all of whom reside here. The funeral on Friday afternoon was largely attended as the deceased had many friends in both city and county.

CLEAR OF DEBT.—The F. C. Baptist Church has made a rapid advance. There was a debt on the building of something over \$5,000 which was felt to be an incubus by the people. The interest charge was heavy and many schemes of the church were sadly hindered by this debt. A meeting was held a few evenings since, the subject discussed and a subscription list opened to see if the debt could not be liquidated. The result has exceeded the most sanguine expectations. At the meeting sums were subscribed aggregating \$4,300 and funds have since been sent in sweeping away the debt.

HOUSE DISSOLVED—His Honor the Lieut. Governor has dissolved the House of Assembly. Nomination is filed for October 15 and polling for the 22. There has been some excitement among the closet-politicians. The opposition in York have been troubling themselves and others for some time past trying to form a ticket but it has failed to materialize as yet.

The Bulletin on Pulpwood recently issued by the Dominion Forestry Branch at Ottawa, states that one-third of the pulpwood used in Canada in 1912 was manufactured into pulp by the sulphite method, the other wood constituents being dissolved out by a solution of calcium sulphate and piped into the rivers as waste liquor. Thus one-half of every cord of pulpwood becomes absolute waste, as also the 140 lbs of sulphur used in its dissolution, for the sulphur becomes so combined organically that it cannot be economically recovered.

It is calculated that material valued at over one and a quarter million dollars is thus wasted in Canada each year.

The utilization of this enormous waste is, therefore, a very important problem in Canada, where an increasing amount of sulphite pulp is being manufactured every year. As a temporary expedient, the use of this waste liquor as a road dressing is to be desired, for it would prevent the contamination of the rivers on which sulphite mills are situated.

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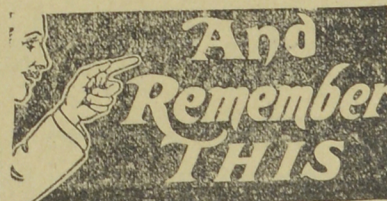
