"It is the farmer alone upon whom the whole burden of the new Liberal fiscal policy is to fall. His alone amongst Canadian industries is to be exposed to unobstructed competition from other countries. The new battlecry of Liberalism is down with prices on the farmers' markets." They declare that it does them harm rather than good They sell their wheat for prices lower than could be obtained in the United States, and purchase their flour for prices higher than are obtained for the same flour in the British market
