HARVEST OF THE SEA

Great Wealth in the Fisheries of the Pacific Coast

The halibut of British Columbia have an enviable reputation, for they are less over-grown and of finer texture than the Icelandic and North Sea fish; a length of five to six feet and weight of 250 pounds is exceptional for the British Columbia halibut. The waters between Queen Charlotte Islands and the mainland, especially off Rose Spit, and off the west shore of Banks Island, were at one time veritably overcrowded with halibut.

Very large fish were often taken then, some weighing 150 pounds, but the general weight now is only from 20 to 60 pounds. The halibut are scattered all over the strait, but regular migrations have been noticed, and where the waters of Dixon entrance meet the currents, moving from the south through Hecate Strait, and food appears abundant, the fish congregate in large numbers.

The superabundance of herrings on the coast of British Columbia has been recognized from early times, but, as the local demand was insignificant, no herring fishery can be said to have existed, until about thirty years ago. At intervals, and in a desultory way, various parties engaged in the herring industry, and quantities were converted into oil and guano. Within the last ten years, however, the value of this fishery resource has been realized.

Herring occur all along the coast as far as Alaska, though in sheltered areas, like the waters near Nanaimo, Ucluelet, Barkley Sound, Virago Sound and Queen Charlotte Islands, the schools appear to form solid phalanxes.

Discovery of Rock Salt

An extensive bed of rock salt has been discovered on the Skeena River, about 45 miles from Prince Rupert. Five holes have been drilled, about a mile apart, and salt has been struck in every case at depths varying from 50 to 250 feet. About eight tons of salt has been raised. 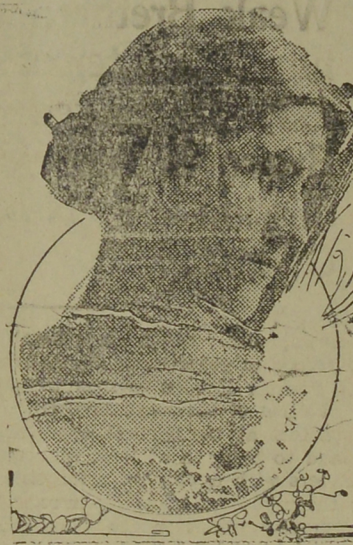
Indian Mortality

NON-DRINKING SHEEP

Apparently Thrive Without Water Except Dew and Plant Juice

Sheep on the Nebo national forest range, Utah, go four and a half months without water except for such moisture as they get from the dew and the juices of forage plants.

Grazing sheep on a range entirely destitute of water is a recent innovation due to the increasing demand for forage and the efforts of the forestry officers to find a place on the forest ranges for all the stock that can safely be admitted. The area on the Nebo which has proved usable by sheep is high and rocky, a portion of it being above timber line, and it has neither springs nor streams of sufficient stock or accessibility to be used for stock watering purposes. The grazing season lasts from June 15 to October 31, and during this period of four and a half months the animals do not get a drink.

Under such conditions, however, the sheep do extremely well, and the lambs from this range have an average weight at the close of the season of 68 pounds on the Chicago market, which is rather above the normal weight from that vicinity.

In one area on the Targhee forest in Idaho sheep get water only twice during the four-months' summer grazing season. There is no water on the range, but the sheep are driven to a nearby stream lower down the mountain side.

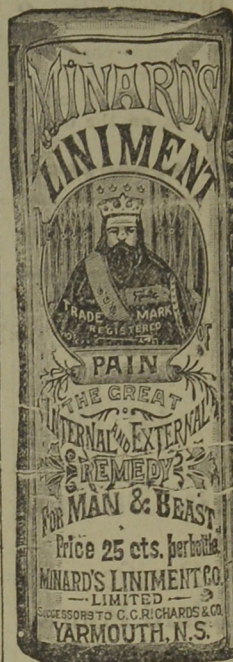
