## "ETHER DAY" OBSERVED IN BOSTON

Boston, Mass., Oct. 16—"Ether Day" the sixty-seventh anniversary of the introduction of ether as an anaesthetic in surgery, was observed at the Massachusetts General Hospital today in pursuance of an annual custom inaugurated many years ago. It was on Oct. 16, 1846, that Dr. Thomas Norton of the hospital staff performed the first surgical operation on a patient under the influence of ether. The anniversary exercises today were attended by many physicians and surgeons of wide prominence, including representatives of medical schools and hospitals throughout the country.

## TO DISCUSS UTILITIES CONTROL

St. Paul, Minn., Oct. 16.—The most notable feature of the program arranged for the meeting of the Minnesota League of Municipalities, which opened here today for a two days session, is a joint debate on the question of public utilities control, with two speakers on each side. Halford Brickson, a member of the Wisconsin commission, and C. A. Russell of Brainerd will speak in behalf of State control, while the negative side will be taken by T. C. Richmond, an attorney at Madison, Wis., and a speaker from this State. There will also be addresses by a number of other prominent speakers.

## GASOLINE FUMES

The Gas Given off by This Popular Fuel Acts Like an Anesthetic

Gasoline fumes, in addition to being highly inflammable, are also poisonous to the human being. This fact has only recently been developed by medical authorities and it is possible that its discovery might have the effect of explaining some deaths that have been assigned as probably due to other causes. The fumes are poisonous under certain conditions and it is well to have these conditions thoroughly understood, else there may be more deaths from this cause. Combined with enough air there is little or no danger, but when a person is subjected to the influence of the fumes in a confined place the chances are that they will be affected in a way that might have fatal results. So far as their investigations have gone the chemists and medical men who have investigated gasoline poisoning have come to the conclusion that its effects are very much like being overcome with an anesthetic. The victim suddenly collapses and becomes unconscious. During the period when consciousness is lost the people behave very much as do people who have been subjected to ether as an anesthetic. Some of them fight and scream and some of them are perfectly still. As in the case of an anesthetic, the recovery is dependent on the individual. It is not often that there are any bad effects from it, however. In a number of cases that have occurred in Montreal, where the discovery of the poisonous nature of the fumes has been investigated, recovery has been prompt and the victims were able to return to work the next day. In all of these cases, however, restorative measures were commenced immediately on the men being overcome—the victims being men in these cases—so that there is no evidence of what the fumes will do if the person overcome by them is not given immediate attention. That is, there is no positive evidence so far as the Montreal authorities know. There have been cases where deaths occurred which, in light of the discovery that has been made, may safely be assigned to inhaling gasoline fumes. One of these was the case of a man who was painting or cleaning the inside of a gasoline tank and was found dead. Another was the case of a chauffeur who was found dead in a garage where there was no ventilation and where the fumes of gasoline were very strong. It is pointed out that, in view of the universal custom of using gasoline as a cleaning material by women, it would be well to see that the room where it is used, is well ventilated with a steady current of fresh air. There is no danger so long as the fumes are not confined—just as there is little or no danger of explosion when the gas is allowed to mingle freely with the air.

## A RECORD STURGEON

One Fish Provided a Meal for 1,000 People

Very seldom indeed is the sturgeon the funny monster which Edward II. made a Royal fish, and which, when caught in the Thames, becomes the property of the Crown, captured in English waters nowadays. For this reason not a little interest was aroused a few days ago when it was announced that a sturgeon 9 feet 9 inches in length, weighing 439 pounds, had been caught in the River Delph at Walsby Washes, near Littleport, Norfolk. This fish, which according to the estimate of a salesman at Spitalfields, who ultimately sold it for \$30, would provide a meal for nearly 1,000 people, had been noticed in the river, and attempts had been made to shoot it. But the cartridges used were loaded with shot too small to have any effect on the sturgeon's hard skin. A large net, therefore, was drawn across the river, after which a boat was rowed alongside the fish, when one of the men succeeded in forcing in large and powerful hook attached to a strong pole into his throat. This enabled him to keep its head out of water just long enough for the fish to be killed with a gun. Some idea of its size and weight may be gathered from the fact that five men were required to land it. This, however, is by no means the largest sturgeon which has been caught in English waters. The record was a fish weighing 460 pounds, while in the North Sea fish weighing as much as 562 pounds and 735 pounds have been captured by trawlers. It is pointed out that one of the most remarkable facts about the fish netted in the North Sea is that they are similar to the American species, whence it would seem that the specimens caught from time to time in our waters must have made the voyage across the Atlantic, since the fish appears to have died out as a regular inhabitant of British waters. Sturgeons pass the greater part of the year in the sea, but periodically ascend large rivers, and it was due to this characteristic that the specimen was caught recently in the River Delph. Not only do they attain great size and weight, but, according to the estimates of some experts, they sometimes live as long as two hundred years. Apropos of the fact that Edward II. made the sturgeon a Royal fish, it is interesting to note that its flesh, quite apart from the fact that caviare is made from the roe, is always held in great estimation, and in olden days was always reserved for the table of the King.

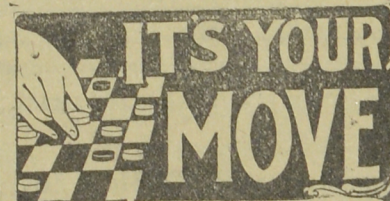
