partment were Abram Alward, T. W. Gregory and T. A. Belmore.

Other prize-winners in this department were the N. B. Telephone Company, which attracts much attention. Here is located the private exchange by which connection with all telephones on the grounds is made. This exhibit contains also various types of desk and wall phones for office or residence use and also the switchboards for private systems. The F. B. Edgecombe Co., Fredericton's progressive dry goods firm, has two booths, one of which displays furs and the other gentlemen's Art Clothing. An exhibit of kitchen ranges by Colwell & Jennings attracts a great deal of attention and the same is true of the display of pianos by McMurray & Co.

John J. Weddall & Sons have a particularly fine exhibit of furs which attracts much favorable notice. Lemont & Sons, the house-furnishers, occupy a well located central space where Hoosier Cabinets are being exhibited and boomed. Chief among local manufacturing houses which have exhibits are the Hartl Boot & Shoe Company, which has a very attractive display of fine footwear in the balcony of the building. The Palmer-McLellan Shoe Company has also a most interesting exhibit of oil-tanned footwear. Outside firms which have good exhibits are Amherst Pianos and Mages's Sons Ltd., Furriers of St. John. In the balcony at the front of the building are two very attractive booths side by side, J. F. VanBuskirk having one of the best displays of furs at the exhibition and E. O. MacDonald has a first-class exhibit of pianos and other musical instruments.

The Cowan has a very nice booth in this building and The Daily Telegraph of St. John, has its circulation department well represented.

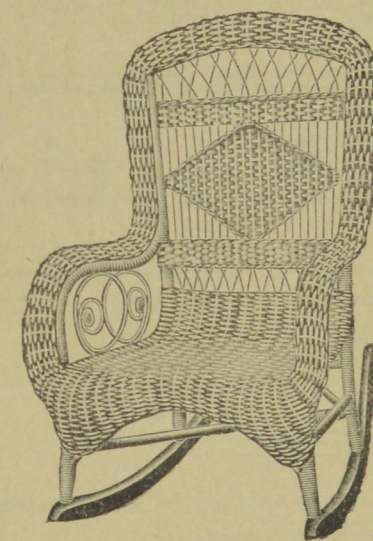
