Jack Morrison Now on Midway at Exhibition Was Employed by Thaw, s Legal Advisers to Induce Jerome to Gamble

An incident of the famous legal proceedings in connection with the arrest of Harry E. Thaw at Coaticook, Que., and his subsequent examination at Sherbrooke, is brought vividly to Fredericton people in the presence at the Fredericton exhibition of the man who framed up the poker game in which District Attorney W. T. Jerome of New York took part and which resulted in his arrest on a charge of gambling. This man is Jack Morrison, who is connected with one of the Midway shows. He was in Sherbrooke at the fair on the same business and was there approached by those associated with the defense of Thaw and asked to frame up a poker game and have Jerome take a part. Morrison consented and arranged the decoy game with such skill that Jerome was arrested as Thaw's sympathizers had hoped.

Morrison agreed to arrange the card game chiefly on account of strong personal feeling against Jerome, with whom he had come in unpleasant contact some years ago when Jerome was acting as district attorney.
