ARE AT VARIANCE**

Mr. Pinder's Friends Anxious to Make Him Minister of Public Works

The Pinder and McLeod factions of the Tory party in York are still at each other's throats and there is not the slightest prospect of a truce being reached. Mr. Pinder wants to be chief commissioner of public works, and is meeting with determined opposition from the McLeod faction. While Hon. Mr. McLeod is slated for the federal nomination in York, he has not yet signified his intention of accepting the honor, although it seems that there is no other course open to him. His friends say that in case he goes to Ottawa he has no intention of allowing his henchmen who hold local government offices to be sacrificed. Indeed, it is said that he has given Premier Flemming to understand that if they are disturbed he (Flemming) will hear something drop.

It is well known that a strong effort is being made by a wing of the Tory party of York to oust Hon. John Morrissey from office and have Mr. Pinder installed in his stead. Mr. Pinder, who is known to be after the scalp of the secretary of the public works department, is said to have tacitly consented to this plot. It is also cordially approved by Speaker Slipp and it was in connection with this matter that he made a pilgrimage to Woodstock this week.

A strong effort is being made to smooth matters over so that there will not be an upheaval in connection with the convention to be held next week.

A very impressive service was held at the grave. Rev. Father Hayes reading the prayers for the dead, and being assisted by Rev. Fr. Ryan. The funeral was very largely attended, the chief mourners were, George Hayes, J. J. Hayes Doane, Jas. P. Hayes and J. B. Mahoney. The pall bearers were, P. J. Hughes, Dr., Jas. T. Sharkey, Albert B. Neill, A. Wilfrid Coombes, Peter Hughes, and Edward C. Barry.

The deceased lady was a sister of the late Rev. J. C. McDevitt for many years pastor of St. Dunstan's Church in this city, and was the last surviving member of the McDevitt family.
