ment Hall the visitors and local people assembled and addresses were given. Pres. Jennings presided and introduced Ald. Osborn, who welcomed the visitors. R. S. Gourley of Toronto, retiring president of the C.M.A., responded. He spoke in most congratulatory manner of the optimism prevalent in Eastern Canada and admitted that he was surprised and delighted with the evidence of development which he had observed in the Maritime Provinces. He predicted an increase in population of fifty per cent. within the next decade for the provinces by the sea. The great need was more publicity. He heartily congratulated Fredericton upon its exhibition.

Pres. Jennings, replying, said he was pleased that Mr. Gourley had noticed an optimism in the Maritime Provinces. Personally he had a strong belief in the future of the Maritime Provinces. Development was bound to come and there was no body which could assist more in that development than the Canadian Manufacturers' Association.
