## ATLANTIC OILFIELDS LTD., TO HAVE HEAD-OFFICE IN THIS CITY

Company Capitalized at \$3,000,000 Incorporated to Develop New Brunswick Oil-Shale Deposits—Old Country Capital Interested

Letters patent incorporating the Atlantic Oilfields, Limited, have been issued by the department of the Secretary of State of Canada. The company is to have its head-office in Fredericton and is capitalized at about \$2,000,000.

The incorporators are Alfred J. Gregory, barrister; J. J. Fraser Winslow, barrister; J. Brunswick Gregory, manufacturer; Annie Elizabeth Rush, stenographer; Anna Louise Finnamore, stenographer, all of Fredericton.

The capital stock of the company is to be divided into 24,000 shares of \$25 each, making a total capital stock of \$600,000. The company is organized for the purpose of developing the oil-shale deposits of this province and has the right to search for, quarry, mine or bore for oil, oil-shale, albertite, gypsum and other substances and to carry on the necessary transport and other operations which may be connected with the business. Old Country capital will be behind the new company.

## LATE EBER STONE.

## MRS. JAMES WELTON TOOK BICHLORIDE OF MERCURY TABLETS

Attempted Her Life Sunday—Physicians Summoned in Time to Counteract Effects of Poison—Recovery Is Now Expected

Mrs. James Welton, residing on Westmorland street, took bichloride of mercury tablets Sunday afternoon while in a fit of despondency. The rash act was committed at her home. Medical aid was summoned, Dr. Irvine, Dr. Crockett and Dr. McGrath arriving in a short time, and efforts to counteract the effects of the poison were made at once and with success. This morning Dr. Irvine, who is attending Mrs. Welton, stated that her condition pointed towards recovery.

Little information concerning the case can be obtained at the home, but it is understood that her domestic life has not been pleasant and that domestic troubles prompted her to make the attempt on her life.

Mrs. Welton was formerly Miss King of this city, and has relatives here. Her first husband was the late Sergt. Chas. Shaw of the Royal Canadian Regt. She was married a second time about two years ago. Sergt. Shaw of No. 3 Station, R.C.R., is a son and a daughter also resides here.
