NEWS FORECAST FOR COMING WEEK

Washington, D. C., Dec. 13.—The first steps looking to a reorganization of the Republican party and a restoration of party harmony will be taken Tuesday, when the Republican national committee will meet in Washington pursuant to the call issued by Chairman Hilles last October. The committee meeting is expected to arrange for a national convention to revise the rules of the party. The principal changes demanded are in the basis of representation from the Southern States at national conventions and in the method of electing delegates from States that have primary laws covering that subject. The national convention probably will be called for the spring or early summer of next year. Nothing has been decided as to a convention city. Cincinnati, Detroit, Chicago, Indianapolis, Philadelphia and Washington will put in applications for the convention.

Everything in and around the White House has been put in the best possible order in readiness for the opening of the first social season under the Wilson administration. The initial event will be the Cabinet dinner Thursday evening and the season will close with the navy reception on Thursday, February 15.

Secretary Houston will conduct a public hearing at the offices of the Department of Agriculture Thursday in order that all persons interested in the importation of potatoes from these foreign countries. The object of the proposed quarantine is to prevent the introduction into the United States of the powdery scab and other diseases which might seriously affect the potato production of the United States.

All of the labor unions of Colorado have been invited to send delegates to a convention, to be held in Denver Tuesday to consider the question of calling a Statewide sympathetic strike in support of the United Mine Workers of America, now on strike in the Colorado coal fields.

Friday is the day set for the execution of Harry Spencer, whose arrest in Chicago and subsequent confession of numerous murders, robberies and other crimes startled the country some months ago. Spencer is to be executed at Wheaton, Ill., near which place he robbed and murdered Mrs. Mildred Allison Rexroat, a "tango" teacher, on September 26 last, for which crime he was tried and convicted.

The United States has undertaken to aid the Dominican Republic in holding a free and fair election Monday to choose a new constituent assembly. American Minister Sullivan has notified the leaders of the several political factions of the intention of the United States Government to see that the islanders have every opportunity of expressing their political preferences without interference. The gunboat Dolphin, official ship of the Secretary of the Navy, has been ordered to remain in Dominican waters until after the election.

CHURCH UNION WILL BE ADOPTED

"I think church union will be adopted by next year's Presbyterian Assembly," said Rev. Dr. W. E. Smith, of Fredericton, N. B., at the Windsor Hotel last night. Dr. Smith is one of the foremost Presbyterian clergymen in the Maritime Provinces.

With Rev. Frank Baird of Woodstock, a strong opponent of church union; Rev. James Ross and Judge J. G. Forbes of St. John, Dr. Smith is on his way to Toronto, where the church union question is to be dealt with by the fifty members of the committee to whom the question was referred at the assembly last summer.

"Our report is likely to favor union, but there will be a minority who have their case all prepared and are expected to put up a stiff fight. Then next year it is likely the assembly will adopt our report and decide for union," said Dr. Smith.

LABRADOR'S INHABITANTS

This Coast Country Has Many Holiday Attractions

There are about 3,500 white people in Labrador who live there the whole year round, and about half as many Eskimos. Dr. Grenfell, whose name is always connected with Labrador, said that he did not know how the whites got there, but he did know that they prefer remaining there to going elsewhere. Some of them have gone forth into the world of houses and stucco and sighed for the bare rocks which were their homes, amongst which they played and where they lived a life which was absolutely free of the tax collector. Not a great deal was known of these people before the Deep Sea Mission went to the coast. The men fished in the summer and hunted in the winter; the women, in the absence of the men, lived in little bits of huts; they caught disease, and if nature was kind, they lived; if otherwise, they died. The only persons of their own class whom the doctors engaged in the task of helping these people meet are occasional summer tourists who visit Labrador. Dr. Grenfell is enthusiastic over the holiday attractions of this little-visited land. There is good goose and duck shooting, fine salmon fishing, and as for the scenery, he declared that the flocks "simply knock Norway out of the water."



STABLE FLOORS

Cement is Best But Should Have Plank Covering For Cows

The stable floor is a prolific source of trouble unless it is properly made. One may go into many a barn and find the floors reeking with filth although they look clean to the casual observer. The old-fashioned plank floor that was laid on top of the ground allowed the moisture and the filth to work through the cracks, making mudholes that were just about as pure as a cesspool from which the odors and gases arise in the stable, especially during hot weather. This same floor may be swept as spotless as stable floors are considered, but it can never be cleaned until conditions beneath are remedied.

All plank floors are not like this, but many of them are and that in itself is sufficient to condemn the general use of this material for such purposes. Furthermore, with the prices that now prevail one can hardly afford to put such a valuable commodity as a good plank under the cows.

The cement floor is as nearly ideal as anything known to dairymen at this time. It is practically germ proof, it can be washed, it does not allow for any seepage of moisture, there are no unsightly cracks, all of the manure can be saved and the barn can be kept cleaner and more free from stable odors.

Naturally the cement floor is not most ideal for the cow's feet; it is not the best place for her to stand unless it is covered with plank or cork brick or blocks, but the cement offers the right foundation for this covering and it is necessary if one would have the best stable floor.
