GOOD WORK BY FRUIT GROWERS ASSN.

The Association continues to do good work for the fruit growers and is creating a steady interest and increase in co-operative effort. During 1912 and 1913 the Association supplied its members with nearly 30,000 fruit trees, most of which were at 22c., 23c., 24c. and 25c. per tree, and also with several thousand small fruits. The nurseries in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia have been supplied by the Association with scions and buds taken from good bearing trees of the varieties most in demand in the province and consequently the demand of Maritime grown trees of the best varieties true to name available for planting in New Brunswick in the spring of 1914 is practically twice as large as three years ago. As the bulk of the trees placed throughout the province annually by agents are sold at prices ranging from 30 to 45 cents per tree it is easy to see that the Association is saving its members hundreds of dollars in the purchase of their fruit trees. By ordering nursery stock in large quantities, the Association gets the very best the nurseryman has to offer and gets it at wholesale or the lowest possible price as the agent's commission and expenses are omitted. In a similar manner a large quantity of spraying materials consisting of lime sulphur and lead arsenate were purchased from Nova Scotia by the Association and distributed to its members at cost price. Other supplies such as pruning tools and packing appliances and materials, etc., are secured at cost price on request.

WORLD CONFERENCE OF SURGEONS

Chicago, Ill., Nov. 10.—The fourth annual session of the Clinical Congress of Surgeons in North America opened in this city today, and will continue through the week. Nearly 3,500 surgeons from all sections of the United States and Canada and a number from Europe, are to give addresses on the progress in surgery made during the past year.

Dr. W. Arbuthnot Lane of London will be one of the speakers tomorrow night, to be followed by Dr. John B. Deaver of Philadelphia. The Wednesday night meeting will be given over to the discussion of the cause and cure of cancer. Professor Kronig of Freiburg, Germany, will lead the programme, which includes addresses by Dr. Roswell Park of Buffalo, Dr. William J. Mayo of Rochester, Minn., and others.

WITHIN AN ANT HILL

Tiny Insects Have Their Homes Carefully Planned

When you step on an ant hill you crush ruthlessly a complicated architectural structure far more wonderful in its way, than a modern skyscraper. Entering the hill at the hole in the top an invader instantly encounters a soldier ant, always on guard. The first floor is the guardroom. Floor 2, counting downwards, is the summer sleeping room for the workers. In the third floor the workers live and dine. No. 4 is storage room, while the fifth floor provides the barracks for the ants' standing army. They form the guard for the queen, who lives and lays her eggs on the floor below. Next—floor 7—come the storage rooms of fodder and grain for the milk-cows—the aphids, who suck up "milk" from blades of grass with their feet, so that the ant milkmaids can afterwards "milk" them by stroking their legs until a drop of "milk" falls. Other little insects collect honey, and are "milked" in the same way.

The stables, where they are kept, are shown on floor 8. Then, below the earth we come to the ninth floor, the nurseries, where the milk and honey which the milkmaids have secured is handed over to the baby ants, just hatched as larvae, from eggs. Below—floors 10 and 11—are other nurseries, where the baby ants are cared for in various stages of their growth.

Next we find the winter quarters of the ant kingdom, and on the same floor is the graveyard; for the ant city in a hill is complete even to a cemetery. Last of all is the queen's winter apartment.

SAFETY IN THE STREETS

The "Prison of Silence"

Republican Portugal still tolerates a prison whose carefully-planned, diabolical torture is enough to make prison reformers turn in their graves.

In this prison, called the "Prison of Silence," in a grim castle on the outskirts of Lisbon, nearly everything that human ingenuity can suggest to terrify the prisoners is done. The corridors, piled tier on tier five storeys high, extend from a common centre like the spokes of a huge wheel. The cells are narrow and tomb-like, and within each stands a coffin. The attendants creep about in felt slippers. No one is allowed to utter a word. The silence is that of the grave. Once a day the cell doors are unlocked, and the half a thousand wretches march out clothed in shrouds and with faces covered by masks, for it is part of this hideous punishment that none may look upon the countenance of his fellow-prisoners. Few of them endure this torture for more than ten years.

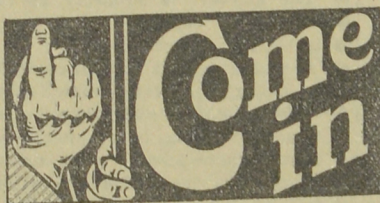
