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THE EXHIBITION

What promises to be the most successful exhibition ever held in Fredericton will be formally opened this evening by His Honor Lieutenant Governor Wood. The collection of exhibits, both agricultural and industrial is quite the equal of any ever shown at a fair in this province and a pleasant surprise awaits all who attend. Fredericton has established an enviable reputation as an exhibition town and this year the indications are that all previous efforts will be eclipsed. The thousands of people who will invade Fredericton this week will be thrice welcome. They will see the most charming little city in the Maritime provinces, a city which in the enterprise, progressiveness and hospitality of its citizens takes second place to none of the same population. Complete arrangements have been made for the housing of visitors and we feel certain that this year as in former years that they will thoroughly enjoy themselves.

President Campbell and his energetic board of directors have worked hard to make the exhibition of 1913 and unprecedented success. They have given cheerfully of their time with this end in view and their fellow citizens owe them a debt of gratitude.

All departments of the exhibition are most complete. The display of live stock would be a credit to any country. The manufacturing industries of the province are well represented and the exhibit of fruit, vegetables, dairy produce etc., is the finest ever seen here.

The educative value of the exhibition cannot be measured in dollars or cents. It is a creditable show in every sense of the term add every citizen of New Brunswick who has the welfare of his province at heart should make an effort to attend.

THE NAVAL QUESTION

Sir Richard McBride, Premier of British Columbia, in the opinion of the Toronto Globe, uttered a good deal of nonsense about the navy question in an interview he gave the Morning Post on his arrival in London. He had no warrant for asserting that British Columbians are "all to a man behind Borden" in this matter. It is quite well known all over Canada that a large proportion of the people of British Columbia prefer a Canadian navy, and for the very good reason that in the events if to institution there would be a "fleet unit" on the Pacific as well as on the Atlantic. It suits Sir Richard to ignore the agreement arrived at by Canada and Australia in 1909, with the sanction of the British Admiralty: that these two countries should in co-operation assume the task and perform the duty of guarding British interests on the Pacific Ocean. Australia has carried out what she then undertook, and Canada will do the same thing as soon as Canadians afford an opportunity to get it done by a Liberal Ministry. When that time comes Sir Richard McBride will express his real sentiments in approval of what has been done.

It was quite beneath the dignity of a Canadian Provincial Premier to accuse the Liberal party of shirking "their obligation to undertake their share of the Empire's naval responsibilities." The Liberals of Canada are just as good Imperialists as the Conservatives are: far better, indeed, for at the last general election they fought the Quebec Nationalists, of whom Mr. Borden has taken three into his Cabinet. In the debate on the Naval Service Bill of 1910 Sir Wilfrid Laurier defined the Liberal attitude on the fleet question by stating that "when Britain is at war Canada is at war," and that when the Canadian fleet is in actual naval service its vessels will be under the absolute control of the British Admiralty. Sir Richard McBride is perfectly familiar with that debate and, of course, with these pronouncements.


