### MEASURING HAY IN STACK

For obtaining the number of tons  
of hay in a stack, the first step is  
to measure the width and length with  
a tape line, and then what is known  
as the overthrow, that is, pass a tape  
line from the bottom of the stack on  
one side over to the bottom on the  
other side, and divide this measure-  
ment which is called the overthrow  
by three, then multiply the length by  
the width, and this by one-third of  
the overthrow—this gives you the  
number of cubic feet in the stack. Of  
course, if the stack is different widths  
or different heights you will have to  
take the measurements in several  
places and obtain the average of these  
by adding them together and dividing  
by the number of measurements made.

The number of cubic feet of hay  
per ton varies considerably with the  
length of time that it has been stacked.  
With newly stacked hay it will take  
about 500 cubic feet to equal a ton.  
If it has been stacked for two to three  
months from 350 to 400 cubic feet  
will equal a ton. After you have ob-  
tained the number of cubic feet in  
the stack, divide by the number of  
cubic feet in a ton taking into con-  
sideration the length of time that the  
hay has been stacked.

### Diet and Endurance

The Roman soldiers, who built such  
wonderful roads, and carried a weight  
of armor and luggage that would  
crush the average farm hand, lived  
on coarse brown bread and sour wine.  
They were temperate in diet and  
regular and constant in exercise. The  
Spanish peasant works every day and  
dances half the night, yet eats only  
black bread, onions, and watermelon.  
The Smyrna porter eats only a little  
fruit and sour olives, yet he walks off  
with his load of one hundred pounds.  
The coolie, fed on rice, is more active  
and can endure more than the negro  
fed on fat meat.

told by Gatekeeper Henry Anderson  
that there were orders that only  
workmen and exhibitors were to be  
admitted. At his request they left  
the grounds.

Rev. Dr. Smith, when asked today  
by The Mail concerning the incident,  
said that Rev. Mr. Wilson and him-  
self went to the grounds as private  
individuals and not as representatives  
of the Ministerial Association or the  
Lord's Day Alliance. Personally, he  
did not know if either of those bodies  
would act in the matter of the non-  
observance of the Sabbath at the ex-  
hibition. At the exhibition grounds  
Gatekeeper Anderson, after they had  
entered, came to them and said that  
no preachers were to be allowed on  
the grounds. On being asked why  
preachers were being singled out, Mr.  
Anderson said that no persons but  
workmen, officials or exhibitors were  
allowed on the grounds.

Rev. Dr. Smith informed The Mail  
further that he intended to make  
nothing of the incident. It had struck  
him as peculiar that he and his com-  
panion were excluded when the gen-  
eral public appeared to be admitted  
freely to the grounds. In his own  
opinion much of the work being done  
at the exhibition yesterday was un-  
necessary.

## IN SESSION AT WINNIPEG

Winnipeg, Man., Sept. 15.—The four-  
teenth annual meeting of the Cana-  
dian Congress of Charities and Cor-  
rections, which was informally open-  
ed in this city today, has attracted  
several hundred delegates from cities  
in all parts of the Dominion. The  
sessions of the conference will con-  
tinue until next Wednesday and will  
be devoted to the consideration of a  
wide range of subjects pertaining to  
the organized work of charity and  
correction. Judge Ben Lindsey of  
Denver, Rev. J. W. Macmillan, D.D.  
of Halifax, Sourney Dinwiddie of  
Duluth, and a number of other social  
workers of wide prominence are sched-  
uled among the speakers.

## ODD FELLOWS IN SESSION

Minneapolis, Minn., Sept. 15.—  
With delegates present from all  
parts of the United States and  
Canada, the sovereign grand lodge  
of the Independent Order of Oddfel-  
lows assembled in Minneapolis today  
for its eightieth annual session.  
Governor Eberhart delivered the ad-  
dress of welcome on behalf of the  
State and Mayor Nye on behalf of  
the city. The greeting on behalf of  
the grand encampment of Minnesota  
was delivered by Grand Master H.  
W. Phillips. Grand Sire D. A. Kel-  
ler, of San Antonio, replied to the  
addresses of welcome. The grand  
sire then delivered his annual report.  
At the conclusion of the reading of  
the report the lodge went into  
secret session. For the remainder of  
the week an attractive programme  
of entertainment has been prepared  
for the visitors, of whom there are  
many thousands from all parts of  
the continent. A big street parade  
and a programme of prize drills by  
teams representing the military  
branch of the order will be among  
the features.
