a copy. He called their attention to an amendment to the act which requires banns to be proclaimed in an audible voice on two successive Sundays in the parish where either of the parties resides.

THE CATHEDRAL

The speaker dwelt at some length with the restoration work of Christ Church Cathedral and called attention to the fact that it was the spiritual home of the diocese and was entitled to their support. The generosity of Mr. James H. Dunn in providing a new set of chimes was fittingly referred to, and it was pointed out that the cathedral authorities had been left with a deficit of \$5,500 on their hands. As the cathedral was now as good as new and in some respects even better the loss had not been very great. The deficit was however a serious matter and while the denomination at Fredericton had done their part to reduce it, a responsibility rested upon the diocese, and he hoped it would not be unwillingly to accept it.

In closing his address, His Lordship warmly praised the work of the Women's Auxiliary and the Brotherhood of St. Andrew. His concluding words were: "And now my dear brothers in the faith, I commend you and your work to Him who alone can guide and strengthen you. May the grace of our Lord, the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Ghost be with you all. Amen."

THE RAILROADS

the year 1912 was 1,057,800 Kilometres an increase over the previous year of 27,663 kilometres. The increase in mileage in 1912 was greater by 4,429 kilometres than that in 1911.

Europe had 338,890 kilometres of railways at the close of 1912; America 541,028; Asia 105,011, and Australia 22,501 kilometres.

The greatest increase in railway mileage during the year 1912 was recorded in the United States, where 8,687 kilometres were added, while the increase in mileage for the same year in Europe was only 4000 kilometres.

Of the countries of Europe Germany leads with a total of 61,936 kilometres; then follow: Russia with 61,078; France with 50,932; Austria-Hungary with 44,820; Great Britain with 27,640; Italy with 17,228; Spain 15,997; Sweden with 14,095 and Belgium with 8,660 kilometres.

Q.—Were they difficult to get at?
A.—No. It's easy to get one of those fellows. I could get one now if I wanted to. I have found card sharks too. One of them came here recently and went to a local club and in a few hours cleaned some men out of \$100. Shortly before he cleaned up about \$2,500 here, I singled him out and he left the city, and has not returned.

Q.—Was he boosted by a local man?
A.—I got information that he was brought here by a man in the North End and this man is now looking for him.

Q.—Did you find any more of these slick gammas?

A.—I found a confidence man—probably the best in America. This type of crook is the very worst. He probably thought I was in his trade and he approached me.

Q.—Did the man have the assistance of persons in the city or province?

A.—Yes, he was backed by bankers and other prominent men and one person holding office in the province I believe they did it innocently, however.

Q.—How are conditions in regard to protection of property?

A.—Police protection? You have not any. None of the business houses, offices or residences have any protection.

Q.—How about petty thievery?

A.—There is a lot of petty thievery. It starts by young boys gambling in pool rooms. They need money and they steal to get it with.

Q.—Did you find any pickpockets?

A.—Yes, but they were not clever. They could pick a drunken man's pocket.

Council that the city was to maintain the lights.

After some discussion Ald. Rogers was empowered to wait upon Mr. Crockett and attempt to arrange more favorable terms.

During the discussion it was suggested that the exhibition dynamo might be borrowed or the dynamo of the sewage-pump and used at the city's lighting plant to furnish current for the lamps at the barracks. It was also suggested that some arc-lights in Queen street might be transferred elsewhere on account of the other lamps.

Ald. Farrell moved a resolution to the effect that the provincial minister of public works, Hon. John Morrissey, be requested to install similar electric lamps upon the fence surrounding the Provincial Normal School. The resolution was carried. Ald. Farrell said the Board of Trade was going to pass a similar resolution. He felt that the request would be granted.

Ald. Osborne said similar lights were to be installed about the Officers' Quarters.

Los Angeles, Calif., Nov. 2.—Ort McManigal, whose confession as an accomplice of the McNamara Bros. figured in the trial at Indianapolis of the Union labor leaders whose appeal was taken under advisement yesterday after arguments in the United States Circuit Court of Appeals at Chicago, may be a free man within six days.

County authorities said today that with the decision of the appeals McManigal probably would be released from the Los Angeles county jail, where he has been a prisoner for two and a half years, having left it only for a few weeks to testify for the government at Indianapolis trials last year.

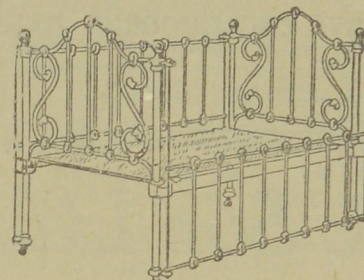

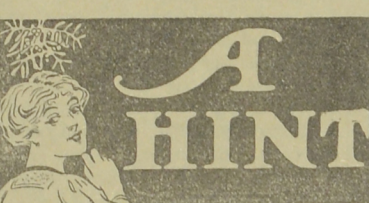
