## FISH MEAL FOR CATTLE

Much Used in Germany, Canada Might  
Profit by it

The use in Germany of fish meal as a supplementary food or relish for young cattle, and especially for pigs and poultry is continually expanding, according to a report made by Mr. C. F. Just, Canadian Trade Commissioner at Hamburg. Germany's entire consumption is imported, chiefly from the British Isles and from Norway. These imports within five or six years rose from a few hundredweights to nearly forty thousand tons worth on an average from \$45 to \$50 per ton. Difficulty is already experienced in meeting the rising demand for fish meal, and German importers are looking for a fresh source of supply.

In England the use of fish meal is spreading rapidly, and the same article is extremely valuable as a fertilizer. Fish meal is produced in various kinds and mixtures according to the varieties of fish that are utilized. White fish, including the cod family, provide the best article, and with the lowest percentage of oil. Next come herring, which are taken in vast quantities purely to convert into meal by the factories in Norway. In England and Scotland the offal of all kinds of fish and the refuse and surplus fish indiscriminately are most successfully manipulated. White fish and cod are dried in the open air, and subsequently subjected to hot air blast in cylinders, the resulting product is finally ground into a coarse meal. Herring are first steamed, then pressed, dried and ground into a fine meal.

The conditions surrounding the Canadian fisheries on the Atlantic are, it is believed, favorable for the establishment of fish meal plants, whereby a commercial use can be made of the superabundant fish and offal.

## Wealth From the Forests

It is now commercially possible to reduce the fifty to sixty per cent. waste formerly left in the woods by the lumbermen to no more than five per cent., by a combination of three well-developed chemical industries, namely, paper-making, wood-distillation (in a modified form) and the manufacture of resin oils. Practically all the valuable constituents from the stumps, tops, branches and defective stems which would otherwise be left to rot in the forest are thus converted into useful commodities.

## Royal Patronage and Liquor Ads.

Father Rotot of the Church of the Immaculate Conception, Montreal, sent a petition to King George asking him to forbid the use of his Royal name and title or the word "royalty," or any word indicating Royal patronage, in any liquor advertisement anywhere within the Empire.
