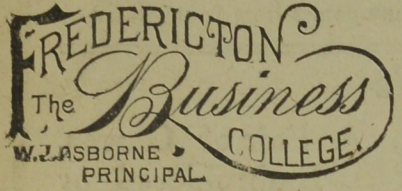

THE LENGTH OF A DREAM

Countless Events May be Crowded

The probability that we get snatches of sleep at odd moments when we suppose ourselves to have remained continuously awake is supported by the phenomena of dreams. Mark Twain accounted for his own "disappearing visitor" experience by the belief that he had unconsciously had a very short nap; and many have explained visions of ghosts as due to dreams during such short naps. For nothing is better established in connection with dreams than that an apparently very long one can occur during an almost infinitesimal time. Alfred Maury had a long, vivid dream of the Reign of Terror, including the trial of himself before the Revolutionary Tribunal and his execution, and was able to show that it all happened during the moment of awakening of the fall of a rod from the bed canopy upon his neck.

Most of us have our special form of bad dreams, born of ill-advised and ill-digested supper, usually. The commonest of the smaller nightmares is the experience of facing a drawing room or a public thoroughfare without clothes. But probably everyone has his special horror on the edge between sleeping and waking.

A Painting by an Actor

Sir J. Forbes Robertson, the well known actor, is proud of the fact that his first bank balance was the result of his painting the church scene in Irving's production of "Much Ado About Nothing," which was hung in the London Royal Academy and since the sale of the Irving relics, rests in the Players' Club in New York. This painting was commissioned by the late Sir Henry Irving, who proposed that Claudio should paint the scene in which he appeared. SALT FOR COWS

Increases Flow of Milk and Acts Like
Condition Powder

Dairy cows in milk require salt daily to do their best work. A lump of rock salt thrown somewhere in the yard may do for the young stock, but cows need a greater quantity than they can get by occasionally licking rock salt. Cows will take a tablespoonful of salt every day, and when they get this quantity they will drink more regularly and give more milk. Salt is required in the system and animals that are deprived of salt entirely lose their vitality. In "Henry's Feeds and Feeding," an experiment on the use of salt for dairy cows is described, and the following facts are cited: "In every case the cows exhibited an abnormal appetite for salt after having been deprived of it for two or three weeks, but in no case did the health of the animal, as shown by the general appearance, the live weight, or the yield of milk, appear to be affected till a much longer time had elapsed. There was finally reached a condition of low vitality in which a sudden, complete breakdown occurred. This stage was marked by a loss of appetite, a general haggard appearance, lustreless eyes, a rough coat and a very rapid decline in both live weight and milk. If salt was supplied at this period recovery was rapid." The time from which the salt was withheld until bad results showed varied with different animals, from a month to a year.

TEN HOUR DAY

Days Were Much Shorter Millions of
Years Ago

In a lecture at the Royal Academy in London on the movement of the stars, Professor H. H. Turner stated that 46,000,000 years ago there were but sixteen hours to a day and twenty-nine days to a month.

Some 10,000,000 years before that the day was ten hours long, and going back still further into the recesses of time, it was reduced to one hour. That, explained Prof. Turner, was when the earth and moon were close together—when they had recently parted company, in fact, and had started on their career as separate bodies.

The principle, said Professor Turner, applied to a very large class of bodies in the sidereal system—the double stars. Astronomers knew two stars in the sky so close together that it never had been possible to separate one from another, even through the best telescopes, though it was known that one of them was very considerably brighter than the other, and it was supposed that one was describing an orbit around the other.

At the other end of the scale there were some stars that had not completed their orbit in the century since they were described by Herschell. Some of them might occupy 200 or 300 years, and there were even instances in which the orbit would occupy thousands of years.

The cause of the changes in the length of our day, said Professor Turner, was the effect of the tides on the earth's rotation. The moon raised two tides—one on one side because she pulled away the water from the earth, on the other because she pulled away the earth from the water.

THE ART OF LIVING

Many people never learn the art of living because they never see the relative importance of duties, opportunities and interests, and never discriminate between the things on which they ought to throw the full weight of their energy and those which they ought to touch lightly in passing. It is so easy to know a little of everything that many people know nothing thoroughly. They become eclectics in religion and their spiritual energy evaporates in a vague interest in the gospel, so to speak, of half a dozen faiths; they read the text books of all the arts, and end by losing whatever capacity for pleasure in beauty they had when they became "globe trotters" in the galleries, museums and studios; they hear lectures on philosophy and get a smattering of the dialect of thought without learning how to think; they join a hundred charities, and never give themselves; they are eager for all the reforms, but have no time to give real support to any of them. They respond to every call, and no sooner start in one direction than they are diverted into another path and never reach the end of any road. —(The Outlook).

A PECULIAR DELICACY

Among many strange foods which the inhabitants of this world partake of, and consider delicacies, perhaps the strangest of all is earth. Yet there are tribes, the Lastians of Siam, who actually eat and enjoy earth. It has never been discovered where these peculiar people contracted the habit, though it is generally believed that it probably came about in the time of a famine when there was nothing else to be had. However, the habit got such a hold upon them that, old and young, rich and poor, alike indulge freely in its consumption.

It is preferred when it has been obtained from the vicinity of waters so that it carries with it a taste of fish. It is made into a pasty substance and smothered into the ground in a hot fire. It can be obtained at markets and at stores, and is served at dinners and at big functions of any description. In some parts of the Congo earth is sold in the shape of apples and oranges, and is given out in various colors—yellow, brown, grey, and even pink, which is looked upon as a very delectable luxury.
