A lump of rock salt thrown somewhere in the yard may do for the young stock. but cows need a greater quantity than they can get by occasionally licking rock salt. Cows will take a table spoonful of salt every .ay, and when they get this quantity they will drink more regularly and give more milk. Salt is required in the system and animals that are deprived of salt en-tirely lose their vitality. Days Were Much Shorter Millions of Years Ago

In a lecture at the Royal Academy in London on the movement of the stars, Professor H. H. Turner stated that 46,000,000 years ago there were but sixteen hours to a day and twentynine days to a month. Some 10,000,000 years before that

the day was ten hours long, and going back still further into the recesses of time, it was reduced to one hour. That, explained Prof. Turner, was when the earth and moon were closs together—when they had recently parted company, in fact, and had started on their career as separate



At the other end of the scale there were some stars that had not completed their orbit in the century since they were described by Herschell. Some of them might occupy 200 pr 300 years, and there were even instances in which the orbit would oc cupy thousands of years. The cause of the changes in the


