In order to stir up our minds by way of remembrance, and that we may be ready to take part in some of the momentuous discussions at the convention of world-wide im-port, it might be well to look at a few conditions of vital l interest. These facts may also be useful in smaller meetings, to workers, whose daily duties are legion, and who have not time to glean anywhere but in their homeland:

The Signs of Progress and Non-

Progress SWEDEN

The temperance reform in Sweden and Norway is making rapid progress The King of Sweden, at the request of his prime minister, has appointed a commission to prepare and report measures for the perfection of the local option laws, and the reform of the Gottenburg system, with the view of ultimate probition of the traffic throughout the kingdom. It is supposed that the unsatisfactory results of the half-century of the Gottenburg system has driven the Government to take these stops, and that this is an all-around investigation, preliminary to national prohibition. There are many demands by prominent persons for this law, and already four-fifths of the people are under prohibition, effected by local veto. The commission will also draft legislation for checking the evils of intemperance, until further prohibitory laws are perfect. In Norway, 8,870 votes have been registered against the liquor traffic, and nearly half the cities and towns are under prohibition. France's large consumption of spirits wine and cider, the drinking of beet is becoming very prevalent. It may not be generally known that the average consumption of beer during the past few years, has been about eight gallons per head and this year will increase to ten gallons, as against twenty-six gailons in the ted Kingdom, and this is in ad dition to the consumption of cider and spirits, which is proportionately large. No wonder the authorities are alarmed; the statistics are appalling. It is estimated that one out of every fifteen Frenchmen is connected either as vendor or distiller with the liquor trade. The helpers of cafes and bars number close on a million: in Paris alone there are 33,000 such establishments, or one for every thirty-four yards of street. There are '900,000 wine growers; that is, people who distil alcohol from their own products, in addition to the 12,000 other distillers and brewers. The wealth and position of these men make the position almost impregnable; but a measure to reduce the number of licenses is now deemed necessary, though only from the awakening of public opinion can any substantial reforms be expected. There is, 'however, a growing anti-alcoholic group in the Cnam France.


