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INORDINATE EXTRAVAGANCE

A comparison between the revenue and expenditures of the Dominion for the past month, August 1913, and September 1911, the last month of the Liberal administration and the last recorded month of the Borden government shows that while the revenue has increased by about 20 per cent. for the month, the total expenditures has increased by approximately 100 per cent. While the revenue for August just past was \$14,547,853, that for September, 1911 was \$12,032,908. The total expenditure for September 1911, the last month of the Laurier government, was only \$9,741,693. Under Borden and Rogers, was \$18,229,069, almost exactly twice as much. It is small wonder that while in September 1911 the Liberal administration made a net decrease in the national debt of \$2,377,529, in August 1913 the Borden government admitted a net increase in the national debt of \$3,081,217. That means that between the last month of Liberal government and the last recorded month of Tory government there is a difference of just \$6,058,741 to the bad. The Liberals were keeping down expenditures and reducing Canadian debt. The Tories are spending recklessly and, despite increasing revenue, are increasing the debt at the rate of almost a million dollars a week according to the last statement.

The Liberal record is economy which kept expenditures so well within revenue that the national debt was substantially reduced.

The Tory record is extravagance which keeps expenditures so far ahead of even the present bounding revenues that, with Canada taking more money out of her taxpayers than ever before the national debt is growing by millions each month.

LABOR'S LOVE LOST

The Trades and Labour Council at Montreal would like Hon. T. W. Crothers to resign as minister of labor. Probably this wish is shared by Premier Borden and his colleagues. Since his appointment to the cabinet Mr. Crothers has been a perpetual thorn in the side of the government. He has consistently made the labor legislation passed by the Liberal government either a dead letter or the means of playing into the hands of "the interests." Where Sir William Mullock, Hon. Rodolphe Lemieux and Hon. Mackenzie King made the Labor Department a real force for the benefit of labor, Mr. Crothers has made it a force for the benefit of himself and his wealthy friends. It is generally suspected that Hon. Mr. Crothers will be hoisted from the cabinet and sent to ornament the Ontario bench before very long—he is returning from England where he has avoided the coal mine strike in British Columbia and the Trades and Labor Congress at Montreal.

But when Hon. Mr. Crothers is no longer minister what will Bro. Samuel Price of St. Thomas do? Will he have to give up his happy existence as commissioner extraordinary to the Dominion and go back to earning his living? Probably that is only a mere matter of Price.

The St. John Standard announces under glaring headlines that the C. P. R. Expresses will eliminate St. John during the coming winter and sail direct from Halifax. This is one of the penalties St. John must pay for being represented at Ottawa by a "spineless" minister. During Hon. Dr. Purvis's term of office as minister of Public Works St. John was regarded as the winterport of Canada.

Way out in Vancouver, B. C., a few days ago Hon. J. D. Hazen boasted that "We are the Master's of the Situation." He seems to have been unable to prevent the Trans-Atlantic Steamship Lines from giving St. John the go by.

The new United States tariff bill passed the senate on Thursday and was signed by the president on Friday. It is admitted on all sides that the measure will be of great benefit to Canada.

When the Tories were in power before Portland Maine was the winter port of Canada. Now it is to be Halifax. That's what St. John gets from being represented at Ottawa by a man without backbone.

FERMENTATION OF COMMON SAW-DUST

Important Byproducts Made---Acetone and Fusel Oil Produced---Both Very Valuable

A large English company has recently commenced the commercially successful production of acetone and fusel oil from sawdust by a simple process of fermentation. From these two products isoprene can be derived which latter can be changed into rubber, merely by allowing it to lie in contact with a small quantity of the metal sodium. This synthetic rubber vulcanizes readily and compares favorably with the natural product in resilience, durability and price.

Acetone is used in the manufacture of cordite and fusel oil is used in the manufacture of artificial leather cloth. Previously it was chiefly obtained as a by-product in the manufacture of whiskey, brandy and vodka, but by this new process it can now be extracted much more cheaply, making possible a large profit. It is calculated that these by-products of sawdust are worth almost \$400 a ton. As it takes only ten tons of sawdust to yield a ton of these valuable constituents, the resultant profit is obvious.

In Europe, with its densely populated regions contiguous to the forests, the elimination of wood-waste is an economic essential and hence methods have been evolved which, on some cases, utilize even the leaves and roots of trees. While this is not essential in America at present, it is desirable to reduce the waste which takes place in the different processes of transforming the standing timber into finished product, which amounts to something like fifty per cent. of the total volume of the tree. To this end, the Canadian government is establishing a fully equipped Wood Products Laboratory at McGill University in charge of Mr. A. G. McIntyre, B.A., B.Sc., under whose direction experiments will be conducted to discover new uses for common Canadian trees and for the enormous quantities of sawdust and other forms of waste wood which now represent a money loss to the country of millions of dollars annually.

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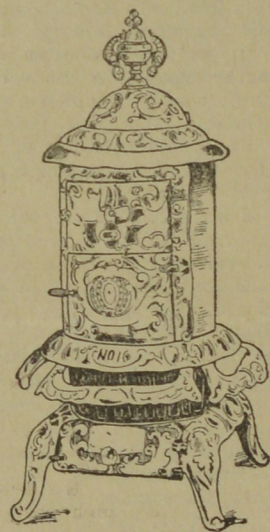

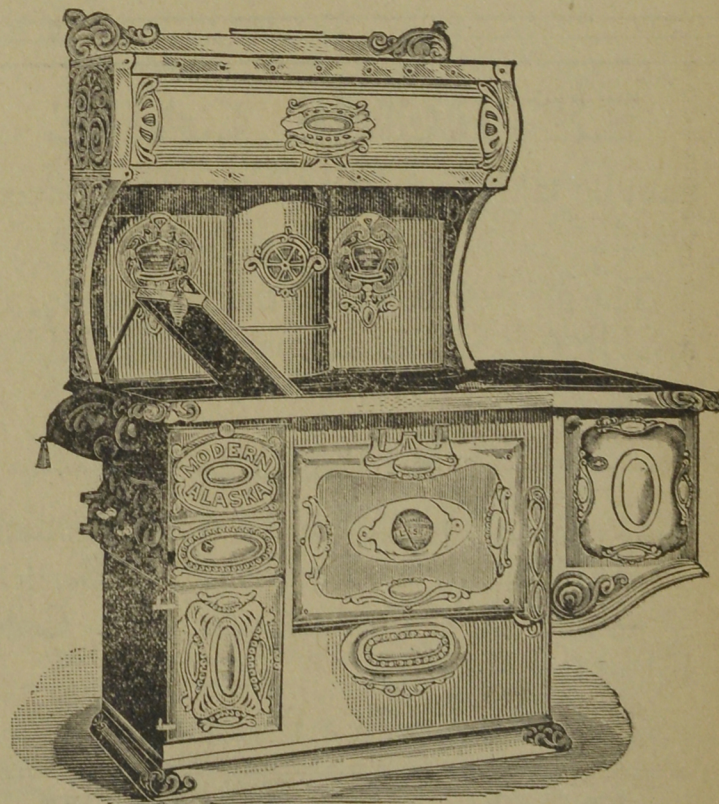
