THE SAXBY GALE

Today is the forty-fourth anniversary of the Great Saxby Gale which October 4, 1869, swept over the eastern portion of North America and did considerable damage. In New Brunswick immense areas of forest were uprooted, buildings were destroyed and lives lost. About the coast and at sea great damage was done and in the Bay of Fundy and adjacent waters the tides were the highest on record.

BRITISH LUMBER MARKET

Mr. Frank Harrison, lumber merchant of Liverpool, is visiting New Brunswick in connection with his lumber interests located on the North Shore. Mr. Harrison reports that the lumber situation in the United Kingdom is at present somewhat unsatisfactory. The strikes in Dublin have caused a general depression which has reflected on the lumber market and made the demand less than normal with prices considerably off. Syndicalist strikes in Great Britain have had a similarly bad effect on the market and prices obtainable there. The outlook for a revival in demand with better prices is good.

NEW TARIFF WILL GIVE IMPETUS TO EXPORT TRADE

Lumber and Farm Products Have Been Held in Large Quantities in This Section to Take Advantage of New U. S. Regulations

A great impetus to export in this section of the province is expected as a result of the new United States tariff which has gone into effect through President Wilson giving his consent to the bill. By next week heavy shipments of farm produce and lumber will be sent through this port.

The expectation of the new tariff has had a marked effect upon exports to the United States through Fredericton. The local U. S. Consular Agency reports falling off in invoices for lumber shipments as compared with the same period last year, of four hundred. Lumber dealers have been holding their stocks and the result has been that a large quantity of lumber is ready for shipment and will be sent to the United States in the near future. Rough spruce lumber of the dimensions on variety is the principal kind exported to the United States. Laths are exported to the same market in large quantities and also boards and shingles. The quantity of lumber of this kind which will be exported to the United States will be greater than ever before.

STRICKEN BY HEART-FAILURE ON JOURNEY

Edward Mersereau of Blissfield Passed Away on Montreal Express Early This Morning--Prominent Northumberland Co. Man

Edward Mersereau of Blissfield, Northumberland county, died suddenly at about two o'clock this morning on the C.P.R. train from Montreal, while en route from the Canadian West to his home. Heart failure, to which the deceased had been subject for some time, was the cause of death. The late Mr. Mersereau was accompanied by his wife, his son James and by two daughters on what has proven to be his last journey to the East.

The deceased was aged sixty eight years. He is a cousin of Lt. Col. G. W. Mersereau of Doaktown and a second cousin of Mrs. H. F. McLeod and Mrs. Wm. J. Scott of this city. He was a prominent farmer of Blissfield and had also conducted extensive lumbering operations in Northumberland county. Some four years ago he followed one of his sons to the Canadian West and and homestead was Lethbridge, Alta. He followed the custom of spending the winter's in New Brunswick lumbering and the summers in Alberta.

Besides the widow a family of four sons and daughters survive. The remains arrived here at noon and will be sent to Blissfield by Intercolonial Railway this evening for interment.
