Acadia Shut Mount A. Out at Sackville

Score was 10 to 0---Gar-
net and Blue Made and
Converted One Try in
Each Half---Mt. Allison
Halves Outclassed---
Acadia Becomes Per-
manent Possessor of
King-Richardson Tro-
phy

Sackville, N.B., Nov. 14---Mount Allison today went down to defeat before Acadia, 10 to 0, after one of the hardest games in the intercollegiate series. The fate of the King-Richardson trophy, which has been swaying in the balance, has been settled. The trophy now is the property of Acadia, who have won it three years in succession and two years previous to 1910.

Both teams lined up for play and were eagerly scanned by the spectators. The general opinion was that for average weight the teams were equal. Word for play was given, and the Garnet and Gold kicked the ball well down the field. Play remained in Acadia territory for some time but gradually worked down into Mount Allison territory, when Mt. Allison got a free kick, which brought the ball back into Acadia territory, where it remained for some time. Andrews of Acadia, in one of his notable wing runs, took the ball well into Mt. Allison territory. Play worked back and forward for some time, but gradually getting into Mt. Allison territory. After some very nice punting, Welton got the ball and dashed over the line. The try was converted.

Fifteen minutes of the first half was gone. Mount Allison tried hard to score but was unable to do so. Leaman of Acadia, in the last part of the first half, made a desperate effort to score again but was tackled by Hertz. Play was kept in Mount Allison territory for a short time when the whistle sounded half time.

The second half started off with a rush. The ball was kicked into Mt. Allison's territory but was gradually worked into Acadia territory by Mt. Allison. A free kick was awarded to Mt. Allison, which took the ball very close to the scoring line, but Mt. Allison, after some hard work, failed to get it over. The ball went back into Mt. Allison territory and with some more clever passing of Acadia's half line, Welton of Acadia, crossed Mt. Allison's line once more. The try was converted.

Mt. Allison kicked off and play went into Acadia territory. The Garnet and Gold tried hard to score but failed, and the ball was carried into Mount Allison territory. Mt. Allison got a free kick and got the ball down to the half line, where it remained till the finish of the game. Following is the line-up:

BEST FOOTBALL COLLEGE WON IN RUGBY SERIES

Scores for Eleven Years Show Acadia
in Highest Position---U. N. B.
Lacked Scoring Ability

The scoring in the King-Richardson Cup series of Rugby games shows some interesting features as far as the relative strength of the three college teams, Acadia, U.N.B. and Mt. Allison, is concerned.

The totals of points made by each team against the others during the eleven seasons is as follows:

U.N.B. 20, Mt. Allison 32.
U.N.B. 21, Acadia 61.
Acadia 59, Mt. Allison 25.
The total number of points scored by the three colleges in those games is as follows:
U.N.B. 41.
Mt. Allison 117.
Acadia 120.

These figures show that the scoring ability of Acadia and Mt. Allison has been about equal, Acadia having a slight margin over Mount A. and about three times as great as that of U.N.B. The latter has scored just one more point against Acadia than against Mt. Allison but has held Acadia down almost as well as the

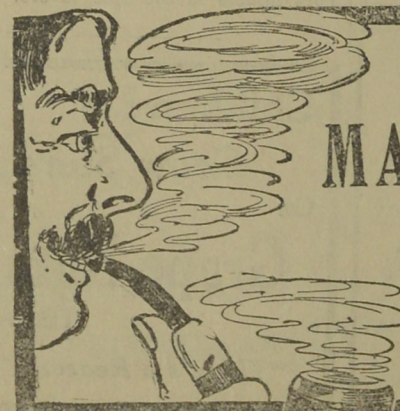

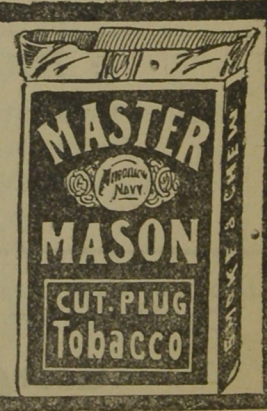
