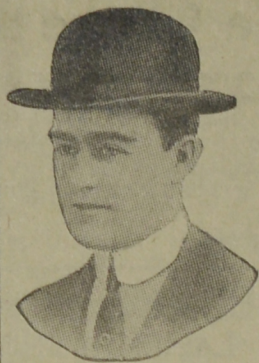

## AROUND THE MARKET.

Business was brisk around the country market this morning and a lot of country produce changed hands. The market, however, was not as large as that of last week. Beef, pork, butter, eggs and vegetables were abundant and were readily bought up at good prices. Butter in print brought from 32 to 35 cents; lamb, 13 to 15 cents per lb.; chickens, 17 cents per lb. or \$1 per pair; pork, 12 and 13 cents per lb.; beef, 7 and 8 cents per lb., and mutton 10 cents per lb. Other commodities sold as follows:—Potatoes \$1.25, turnips 50 cents, carrots \$1.25, celery 8 cents and cabbages 6 cents.

JACK B. McNAIR  
TOOK OXFORD HONORS  
IN JURISPRUDENCE

Rhodes Scholar From U. N. B. Also Playing With University College Rugby XV—A. N. Carter at Same College

Arthur N. Carter, the University of New Brunswick Rhodes Scholar for 1913, has begun his residence at University College, Oxford. He is thoroughly enjoying every phase of the life at Oxford. He mentions the distinguished success of the University's previous Rhodes Scholar, Jack B. McNair who went to Oxford in 1911 and is also a student at University college. Mr. McNair took first class honours in Jurisprudence in two years and is now reading for the coveted Oxford B.C.L. degree. He is a member of the University College Rugby team which is probably the best in Oxford. He is also President of the Colonial Club, the highest honour of the sort open to a Colonial.

Mr. McNair is a native of Arthurville, Victoria County and was prominent on the Rugby team of the U. N. B. throughout his four years at the local college. Mr. Carter is a son of E. S. Carter of Rothesay and nephew of Dr. W. S. Carter, chief Supt. of Education, and was a student at the Fredericton High School before entering U.N.B. He is in his first year at Oxford while Mr. McNair is in his third.

DECISION IN  
EVA SMITH CASE  
MONDAY MORNING

Argument Concluded Friday Afternoon ---Concerns Warrant Issued in Halifax Which Defence Declares Illegal on Various Grounds

His Honor Judge Wilson will give his decision in the habeas corpus application in the case of Eva Smith at eleven o'clock Monday morning. Argument was completed yesterday afternoon, P. J. Hughes for the girl arguing for her discharge and A. R. Shipp, K.C., M.P.P., opposing. The argument dealt entirely with the warrant issued in Halifax, on which the girl was arrested here a week ago last night, Mr. Hughes declaring it to be illegal and incorrect on various grounds, chief among which is that the offense is not sufficiently described in the warrant.

Mr. Hughes, in arguing against the warrant, stated that that document did not show that the girl had been questioned in Halifax as to her condition as she should have been, also that as she is less than fourteen years of age the law supposes her innocence until the contrary is proven. Mr. Hughes argued further that the offence charged, being a common prostitute and a vagrant and not giving a satisfactory account of herself, was not indictable. In the same connection, he pointed out that the girl was arrested here on the receipt of a telegram, November 7, but the warrant was not endorsed by the police magistrate until the 8th, and that arrest by telegram for such an offence was not regular.
