AVERAGE MILK YIELDS

Could be Greatly Increased by Proper
Testing of Cows

A common question in the country is, "How are the cows doing?" What a volume of thought that suggests! If they are doing well is it because of good feed and careful attention, or may it be despite the feed and care they deserve, but do not get? Leaving aside the questions of weather, breed, heredity and persistency of flow of milk, is it possible to account for the remarkable differences in yield that are to be found? For instance, the dairy division at Ottawa found in one locality 100 cows that gave 3,000 pounds of fat in one month, but 100 cows close by in the same county gave only 2,500 pounds of fat. Another lot of 100 cows in a nearby county gave only 2,200 pounds.

Is the ordinary herd keyed up to the pitch of creditable performance, or is it just joggling along in the old rut of "average yields?" Suppose the farmer ascertains his herd is doing "about as well" as his neighbors, does it not seem a great pity that his ambition should end there?

Cow testing has helped many communities to far larger banking business, because it shows that scores of cows and average herds can be made to produce far more than they do at present. Make each cow pay a good profit.

A potato poultice is a good cure for toothache. Bake three or four sliced potatoes in their skins, and when done break them into a flannel bag and hold it to the face while very hot.

CONQUERS AIR POCKETS

French Aviator Brought Model of New
Machine to Canada

Romin Garros, brother of Paul Garros, the famous French aviator, exhibited an interesting object to some Montreal newspapermen. It was the model of his brother's new aeroplane, said to be able to defy air pockets, one of the most fatal dangers to airmen. Garros explained the technical points of the machine.

"I am on my way to visit at the Bleriot farm in the west," said he, "and I take with me this little model. It does not look much, but it may prove the means of saving thousands of airmen's lives. It does what we call increasing the inherent stability of the plane, and this little apparatus which you see on the sides acts as a defence against sudden air currents, that is, they enable the airman to regain his balance after being tipped over. We are experimenting with this new plane in France, and are working it to a high stage of perfection. We are not saying much about it until we perfect it, but since you saw the model under my arm I have told you something about it."

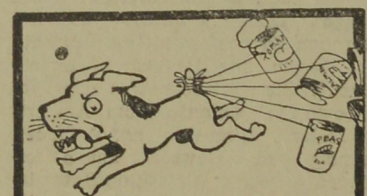

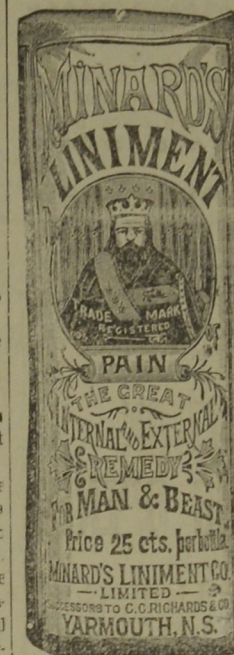
