

WHY PAINT BRUSHES CURL

Perhaps the most frequent trouble with brushes, for which the manufacturer is often blamed, is the bristles curling. In many instances this is no doubt the maker's fault, the bristles not having been cured properly. In good brushes the most common cause for curling is the manner in which the brush is wiped and the way it is put away for the night. If the brush is wiped across the points of the hair, the outside hairs are bound to straggle. A brush should be wiped just to the ends of the bristles and not so that the edge of the bucket will catch the outside bristles constantly bending them outward until they assume a contrary position from that intended. If ends of brushes curl up while painting blinds, grille or fretwork, dip the ends in hot water. This will straighten them.

Natural Timepiece

There is no need for clocks on the Aegean Sea any day when the sun is shining. There nature has arranged her only timepiece, one that does not vary through the centuries. This natural time-marker is the largest sundial in the world. Projecting into the blue waters of the sea is a large promontory, which lifts its head three thousand feet above the waves. As the sun swings round, the pointed shadow of the mountain just touches one after the other, a number of small islands, which are at exact distances apart, and act as hour marks on the great dial.

Sheepskins in Gas Meters

It will undoubtedly surprise many to learn that sheepskin plays an important part in the construction and operation of the gas meter. This leather is used to form the "diaphragms" or two bellows from which gas is drawn when a jet is lighted. They are thoroughly saturated with oil and fastened between two circular pieces of metal, acting precisely as the diaphragm in the human body. When gas is drawn from one, the other is refilled, so the consumer is given an even and constant supply.

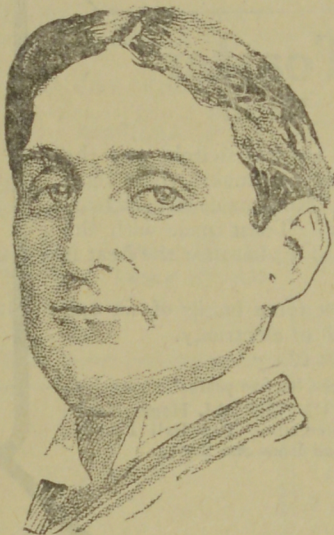

BUSINESS IN 2,000 B.C.

The Babylonians and Their Neighbors Knew of "Short Cuts"

The deciphering of the old Babylonian records of clay have revealed some very interesting facts with reference to business life two thousand years before Christ. In many cases these records relate to trade transactions, to business disputes, incident to the ordinary, every-day doings of the merchants, and to their troubles as to the title to property. There are even data to show how the Babylonians and their neighbors conducted their accounting systems. Nearly four thousand years ago these people had so far progressed in "business" that it was actually found necessary to enact special laws to deal with those who were trying the "short cuts" to wealth. The young man with "prospects," like his prototypes of today, was wont to utilize those prospects in negotiation with the professional money-lender. The banker of Babylon deposited regularly and issued his brick "checks" and bill of exchange, and the law intervened, as it does to-day, to uphold the rights of property. Most careful accounts of revenue and expenditure were kept. These show in many cases that investments in loans and purchases of land, as well as other profitable dealings, were a regular part of the fiscal activities.

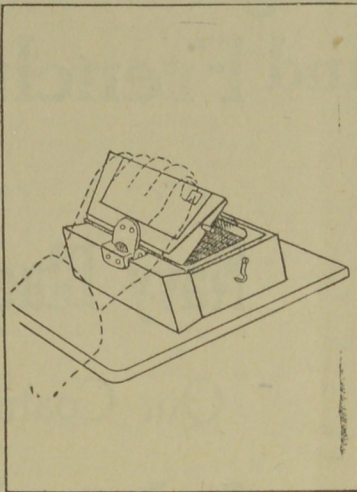

ENVELOPE SEALER

Handy Device Which Facilitates the Handling of the Office Mail

In the days not so long ago, the salivary secretions of the office boy were entirely sufficient for the purpose of moistening all the letters which had been written during the day and which were entrusted to him at the end of the day to mail. Such is not the case to-day, when the facilities for turning out letters and for doing business by mail are so great as to make the sealing and stamping of mail matter a serious problem.

The device shown herewith will apply just the right amount of moisture to the gummed flap of the envelope,

and the inventor has also made provision that when once charged with water the supply will last a considerable time and not dry out by evaporation.

It consists of a moisture-proof box with a hinged lid, the latter having a spring, the action of which is to hold the lid open. Under the lid is one moistening pad, which comes in contact with the envelope flap and this is maintained at the proper degree of moisture by automatically coming in contact with an auxiliary moistener. The envelope is placed on the lid with the flap overhanging, and as the lid is pressed down the water is applied. As the envelope is removed the parts are pressed together and the sealing effected. The moisture-proof qualities of the box prevent the evaporation of the water, which, when not in use is simply closed.

They grow to immense size, and will produce a good many tons of roots per acre on good soil, and are easily stored with little expense, and are highly relished as a part of the daily ration throughout the winter months.

ART OF GROWING TALL

You May Easily Increase Your Height by This Process

Not a little envy must have been created in the minds of those who lack stature, and who aspire to greater physical height than that with which nature has endowed them, by the recent announcement that there is a man living who can add several inches to his height in the course of a few minutes. Such extraordinary growing powers are, of course, unique; but, at the same time, it is possible, without artificial aids, but by merely indulging in certain exercises, to add appreciably to one's height, even after what is popularly known as the "stop growing" period has been passed.

It should be mentioned, however, that exercises are scarcely likely to be beneficial after one has passed thirty years of age, for at that time the bones and cartilages have been so thoroughly matured that it is practically impossible to affect them. The following exercise, however, is often indulged in by army men, and if systematically carried on is said to give a man an extra inch in height.

The main exercise consists in standing, back to wall, until you are just as erect as possible. Then take two paces forward away from the wall, letting the arms hang by the sides with palms outward, and slowly raise the arms above the head until the fingers meet, taking care not to bend the arms in the least, and keeping the palms outward; then lower the arms. By doing this exercise thirty times in the morning and thirty times at night every day for a month or so, one seldom fails to add at least half an inch to the height, and it has been known to give a man even an inch and a half.

There are also certain simple rules which, if carried out, add considerably to one's height. There is the old habit of stooping, for instance. Nearly everyone stoops a little, and if we would only endeavor, as far as possible, to prevent this habit, we should not only look taller but feel taller.

Endeavor to sit up perfectly straight at all times, and stand up perfectly straight. It is not easy at first, particularly when one follows a sedentary occupation. In fact, one is rather apt to feel uncomfortable, but by quiet persistence it will be found quite as easy in a short time to walk and sit perfectly upright as it is to stoop.

If you wish to relax when sitting, don't get into an easy chair and bend over or sag down into a lazy position. Always rest in a chair by leaning back, no matter how far; but never bend forward to rest or talk or read.
