**THIRTY DAYS IN JAIL.**



**WENT TO MONTREAL.**



**HON. JOSIAH WOOD TO FORMALLY OPEN EXHIBITION**

Members of Provincial Government and Other Prominent Men to Take Part—Offices to Move to Grounds Thursday

Hon. Josiah Wood, lieutenant-governor of New Brunswick, will open the Fredericton Exhibition of 1913 at 7.30 p.m. on Monday, September 15. Members of the provincial government will also attend the opening exercises, which will take place in the Amusement Hall, and prominent men from Ontario and Quebec are also expected to be present.

The exhibition of 1913 will be the largest ever held in Fredericton. The live-stock department particularly heavy horses, will be particularly well filled and the exhibit of poultry will be larger than ever. The workmen at the grounds under the direction of Mr. Judson Barker, have made a large addition to the poultry-house, that being made necessary by the large number of entries. This is the fourth addition made to the building since 1903.

On Thursday next the offices of the exhibition will be removed from the Incoles Building to the new Administration Building, which will be completed by Tuesday.

The Agricultural Implement Building, formerly the Transportation Building, has been enlarged. The Ford cars will form one very interesting exhibit in this section but the greater space will be given to farm-machinery. The International Harvester Company, the London Machinery Company and other firms will have large exhibits.

**MORE BUBBLINGS FROM YORK COUNTY'S POLITICAL POT**

Dr. W. C. Crocket Said to be After Provincial Tory Nomination—Ex-Ald. Guthrie May Withdraw From the Struggle

The political pot so far as the Conservative party in York is concerned is bubbling merrily and all on account of the expected vacancy in the county representation in the provincial parliament which is dependent upon the elevation of Mr. O. S. Crocket, M. P., to the bench and the translation of Mr. J. K. Pinder, M. P., to the Ottawa House.

Dr. W. C. Crocket is reported to be the latest aspirant for the nomination. He has rivals, however. Ex-Ald. P. A. Guthrie of this city, Dr. B. M. Mullin of St. Mary's and Mr. W. S. Tompkins of Meductic are all after the nomination and all have greater or less followings.

Messrs. Mullin and Tompkins are able to support their claims by saying that on previous occasions they have stepped down to permit others to be placed in nomination so that a breach in the party would be averted. Ex-Ald. Guthrie has a civic record to which he can point with pride and also an alleged strong following among the younger members of the Tory party. Dr. Crocket can claim to belong to a family that has loomed large in the party in the past. That claim it is understood, already has met with a firm objection.
