## CRUDE OIL ENGINE

## THE LATEST THING

A St. John Concern Exhibiting One of them Near the Highway Bridge

One of the most interesting stands at the exhibition is that of Carmichael & Moore, agents for the General Import and Engineering Co., of St. John. Amongst their specialties should be mentioned a wickless and smokeless oil stove, a Swedish Cream Separator, the latest and best of its kind, Cuckoo Clocks, Gramophones at half the usual price, self playing Accordeons and a number of other interesting novelties.

In connection with this exhibit is also shown a Swedish crude oil motor installed in a boat lying at the highway bridge entrance. A company has just been formed in St. John and a factory built to manufacture these engines. At the head of this concern is Dr. E. J. Broderick of St. John formerly of this city. Many engines have been sold in St. John such as to Brown's Box and Paper Factory, New Brunswick Telephone Company and others.

The engines burn crude oil such as is obtained from Albert county, and the cost of operating is as low as 1/2 cent per hour per horse power.

To give an idea of the saving that can be effected it may be said that Brown's Box and Paper Factory formerly paid about \$5 a day for steam power, whereas they now only pay about \$15 a week after installation of a 20 h. p. crude oil engine.
