EASTERN EDITOR EXTOLS EDMONTON

(Edmonton Journal)
John T. Hawke, proprietor and editor of the Moncton, N. B. Transcript, was a visitor to Edmonton yesterday and Sunday. Mr. Hawke is probably about the best known newspaper man in the Maritime Provinces and has taken no small part in the upbuilding of the city he calls his home.

Mr. Hawke was attending a convention of newspaper editors in Windsor, Ontario, when he decided to come west. He left for the west last night and will go as far as Mount Kobson for the purpose of securing colored slides for illustrated lectures which he intends to give on his return to the far East.

In describing his first trip to the western provinces Mr. Hawke said yesterday that no other city or town impressed him more than Edmonton. "It has about the best location for a capital city I have seen yet," said Mr. Hawke. There are only two other capital cities in Canada that it reminds me of Ottawa the capital of Canada which is located on a river and Quebec is also possessed of the scenic surroundings such as are almost necessary for a capital city and in Edmonton you have these touches of nature that provide splendid view and thereby I see the reason why this city was chosen for the capital of Alberta."
