Mail Adds Bring Results

KEEPS RIGHT TIME FOR WHOLE WORLD

Greenwich Observatory Has Wonderful Instruments Which do Important Work for all Countries

The British Post Office has a plan by which every person in Great Britain can for \$10 a year have his clocks set at Greenwich time every morning. The Observatory at Greenwich is the standard observatory of the world, to which all the rest must in some way or other refer. It is, in fact, the time-keeper of the civilized world.

There are many varieties of observation at Greenwich—general observations of the moon and planets, as well as the wind and weather, but the main business of the Observatory is to preserve absolute accuracy of time, that it may not get out of joint.

The time we mark by our clocks must be checked by the periodical observations of the sky and the stars, and it is to these observations that the staff in the Time Department at Greenwich specially devote their energies. There is much to be learned by the layman who pays a visit to the Observatory.

First of all, there is the mean time standard clock, which is electrically connected with the mean solar clock, but even these two are not sufficient check on one another, and the mean time standard clock is regularly compared with the standard sidereal clock. And if there are any errors in this wonderful instrument, they are discovered by the examination of the fixed stars, which are known as "clock stars."

The sidereal clock is a wonderful affair; it stands in the basement, keeping its inexorable time, which is regulated by the passage of the fixed stars over a filament taken from a spider's cobweb, and laid on the glass of a telescope. The interval between the two successive passages of such a star over the meridian is a sidereal day. These observations are made by what is perhaps the most useful instrument in the institution.

It is a domed chamber, and is supported on trunnions, and is movable, so that it can be made to sweep the entire heavens. It looks very like a curious, old-fashioned cannon and is intended to record the apparent passages of the fixed stars over the cobweb strands, which look more like great bars of iron than frail fly-catching filaments, as you look at them through the instrument.

Then there is the famous time-ball, which is supposed to be the infallible guide of the punctual. It is set on a high tower, and was only wrong on one day late in 1873, and then only half a second.

Practically all the countries of Mid and East Europe, and all round the Empire from Egypt to Canada, and Spain and France, Belgium, Japan, and Iceland set their clocks and watches by standard time from Greenwich, which is the central point of the universe in so far as it fixes the time of the world.

The ships of the world sail by the time "made" at Greenwich Observatory, the world's factories work by it, schools are opened and closed by it, markets are regulated by it, trains are run by it, and all the affairs of the world are controlled by it.

NEW KIND OF DUCK

Carries Young on its Back and Has Red Eyes

A brand new species of wild duck, brilliantly colored, which carries its young on its back, and the young of which are regularly fed by the male bird while the female bird is sitting on a second setting of eggs, was discovered near Lacombe, Alberta, by Senator Peter Talbot.

"The birds were found on a slough near my farm," said Senator Talbot in discussing his find. "The male bird is apparently able to form its body and wings into a kind of boat, and the young always ride around on the back of the parents in this fashion. Even when the parent bird goes under a wire fence and the younger ones are scraped off, they always manage to scramble back on the backs of their parents, and make no effort to shift for themselves, the male bird feeding them constantly."

The color of the new species is remarkable. Except for a dark streak running from the bill back across the head, the head is pure white, while the eye is big and of a bright red color. The neck and breasts of the are bronze in color, while the back is a light grey.

"No one in the vicinity has ever seen ducks of that kind before," said Senator Talbot, "and we cannot find that this particular species ever invaded the Province before."

SAFETY FOR MINERS

Falling Barometer Shows When Explosions May Occur

Look out for mine explosions when the barometer begins to drop! This is the new word that has gone out among the coal managers all over the world. The weather bureau have heard it, too, and are beginning to furnish barometer predictions for mines.

The barometer tells the sea captain of the approach of a storm well in advance of trouble; but the warning is not given so far ahead in the case of the mines. The weather bureau, however, can predict the coming of low pressure as a "low" hove across the country.

Methane is a dangerous gas in mines, developing most seriously in the old workings of coal mines; and it has been established that when the barometer drops, meaning that the pressure of air is decreasing, the amount of methane increases. The gas has less pressure of air to hold it back, and comes stealing out of nooks and crannies. Extra precautions can usually be taken when warning is given in time.
