### DOG TAXES

The attention of owners of dogs within the City limits is directed to in the York County Records under the following provisions of the City number 45518 in Book 107, page 589. By-law relating to dogs:-

"Every owner of a dog shall register such dog at the office of the City Treasurer on or before the FIRST DAY OF AUGUST in each year the tax or fee for each registration shall be ONE DOLLAR, which must be paid to the City Treasurer before registration."

"The owner of any male dog who has not registered it on or before of Fredericton for the year 1913 is may register such dog at any time to the first day of September next succeeding on payment to the City Treasurer a tax or fee of TWO ive taxes forthwith to the City OLLARS; but if such registration Treasurer at his office in the City is not made until after the first day Hall, Fredericton. of September and previous to the first day of January next succeeding allowed on all taxes paid on or bethe tax or fee for such registration fore the 21st day of August next shall be THREE DOLLARS."
