Greeks Won Out in Tenth Inning Having Cut Down Fredericton's Big Lead—Dave Morey Pitched Good Ball—O'Brien of St. John Seriously Hurt at First Base—St. Croix Beat Bangor.

St. John, July 28—There was in the vicinity of two thousand people on the Marathon grounds Saturday afternoon to witness a great battle between the Marathons and the Fredericton team, and perhaps there was no more exciting afternoon this season on the North End grounds. It was indeed a hard game for the speedy Fredericton team to lose and an uphill battle well won by the Greeks that caused the fans to go wild with delight. The score was 7 to 7.

### O'BRIEN INJURED

There was general regret and much excitement caused at the start of the last half of the eighth inning when O'Brien, the fast Marathon third sacker was badly injured. With one out O'Brien went to bat and connected with a nice single and he bled the first safe hit off Morey, the big pitcher imported from Connie Mack's staff at Philadelphia, the crowd loudly cheered O'Brien. The player was dodging off first base when Morey threw a fast one to attempt to catch him. O'Brien slid for the base and the throw was too low for basemen Stone to handle and the ball struck O'Brien on the right side with great force. O'Brien regained his feet but it was instantly seen that he had been injured. He held his side for a few seconds and walked away from the base when suddenly he became unconscious and was caught hold of by other players and laid out on the grass. For a few minutes the players tried to revive the injured man but without success and he was picked up and carried to the club house. Fortunately there was a couple of doctors in the grand stand and a trained nurse and they hastened to the side of the injured man. It was quickly seen that O'Brien was badly injured and the services of a coach was obtained and accompanied by Captain Eien of the Marathons and the nurse was hastened to his room on the Lansdowne Hotel on King Square. Dr. Emery was called in and at one time it was thought that the young ball player would die as the shock had been great. It was found that two of his ribs on the right side had been fractured. The doctor was with him all the evening

and it was not until about eleven o'clock Saturday night that he regained consciousness. He is now out of danger but it is thought that he will be out of the game for the rest of the season. Condon was the pitcher who started the game for Fredericton and Charles was the twirler for the Marathons.


