"Yes, come; I need you. Harry."

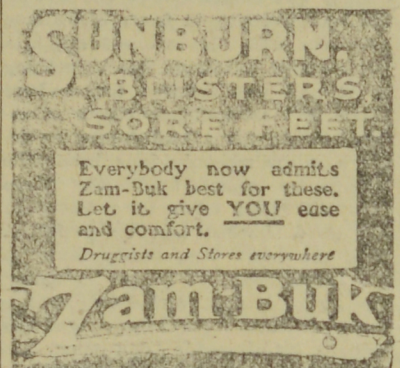
Mrs. Carnegie's action was equally prompt and quite as emphatic, for she notified her brother that both she and her husband would be there to greet him tonight. They reserved rooms at a local hotel and Thaw expressed a wish to his counsel that his sister be brought to the jail immediately on her arrival.

The agents for the Dominion immigration department have seriously considered the probability that Thaw will be released. They do not plan to give him more than a moment's freedom. To sustain their case they have half a dozen clauses in the immigration act which they say are applicable. Among these is one that places in the "prohibited class" any "insane person or persons who have been insane within five years." Another clause provides for the deportation of any person who enters Canada "by force, or misrepresentation, or stealth."

"Wait and see, we will have some surprises for you in the morning."

Such were the words with which J. N. Greenshields, K.C., of Montreal, perhaps the most famous criminal lawyer in Canada, greeted the newspaper men on his arrival in Sherbrooke this evening, to take charge of the legal end of the Thaw case. With the arrival of Mr. Greenshields the whole plan of attack will undergo an entire change of front for the present at least on the part of Thaw's advisers.

That this new policy will mean considerable lengthening of proceedings, is not doubted by those who have their eyes on the legal barometer.

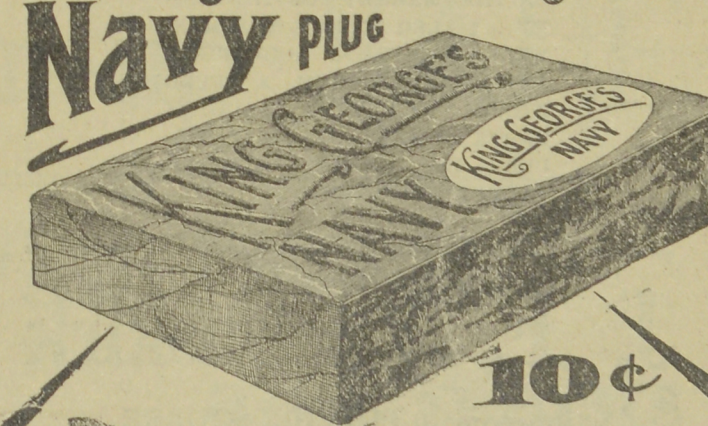
